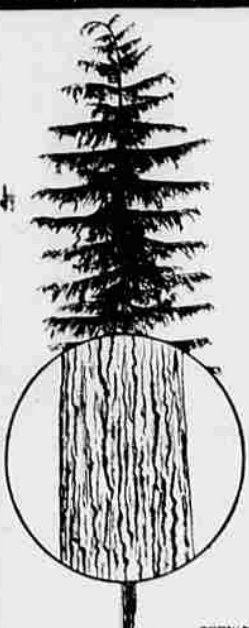

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Straub Deplores Act of Democrats

Portland—UPI—Democratic State Chairman Robert Straub has deplored efforts of what he called "some of my Democratic friends" to prevent a woman from passing out anti-Catholic literature during Sen. John F. Kennedy's Eugene appearance.

The woman was spotted distributing anti-Catholic literature while the Democratic Presidential nominee spoke at the Lane County Courthouse Wednesday.

Straub admitted "some of my Democratic friends tried to shoo her on to prevent her from handing out the literature."

But, he said, "I think this is the greatest mistake... we should pay no attention." He said he felt anybody had the right to express an opinion on religion, as on any other topic.

Straub said he felt questions of economy and foreign relations, and not the religious issue, would decide the presidential election.
