**Florence Adland Planning Appeal**

Los Angeles — UPI — Mrs. Florence Adland, 53, remained free on \$1,000 bail Saturday pending appeal of her conviction and sentencing to 90 days in jail for contributing to the delinquency of her daughter, Beverly, 17.

The platinum-haired Mrs. Adland was scheduled to begin her jail sentence Thursday. But she was allowed to remain at liberty when her attorneys informed Superior Judge Lewis Drucker they were appealing her case.

Drucker found Mrs. Adland guilty of the charge last week in a trial without a jury.

Beverly, the last girl friend of the late actor Errol Flynn, is in custody of a Hollywood evangelist and his wife and has not been permitted to comment on her mother's plight.

**University Students May Borrow \$90,000**

Eugene — The first payment on the National Defense Education act's \$225,441 allocation to the University of Oregon for 1966-67 will enable students to borrow from a \$90,000 fund at the start of fall term.

The first \$90,000 from NDEA will be available for loans when the University opens Sept. 17. If Congress appropriates sufficient funds, the remainder will be available during the year.

High school students, in the upper half of their graduating class, are eligible to apply for loans from the fund as are university students of superior scholastic standing.

Under the act, a student may borrow up to \$1,000 a year to a maximum of \$5,000 for his college career. Loans are repayable after graduation at 3 per cent interest. Students planning to enter the teaching profession, however, may have repayment reduced by as much as 50 per cent.

This is the program's third year. It will bring the University \$483,640 for student aid during the specified period. Added to this total is the one-ninth that comes from university funds. This boosts the government money by \$53,742 and means the program will make available more than half a million dollars.

The current year is the final one during which loans may be made to full-time students who have not yet received money in the past. After 1966-67, loans will be made for four years to students who have already received money under the act.

Some 490 students stand to benefit from the program this year. A large number of these, more than half, will probably be married students, if 1966-67 follows the pattern of previous years.

**Fly-In Planned South of Bend**

**State Government Revision Plan Sent To Gov. Hatfield**

Salem — UPI — A plan for a sweeping revision of Oregon's government has been forwarded to Gov. Mark Hatfield by the governor's advisory committee on government reorganization.

The plan, which would be a step toward streamlining state operations by establishing a semi-cabinet form of government, is expected to be one of the hottest issues before the 1967 Legislature.

Under the blueprint, prepared after months of study by the bipartisan committee, the state would create separate departments of natural resources, corrections, mental health, vocational rehabilitation, labor, commerce and revenue.

A director for each department would be appointed by the governor.

**Fenneman To Talk At High School Press Conference**

Eugene — Featured speaker at the Oregon High School Press Conference Oct. 7 and 8 on the University of Oregon campus will be TV and radio announcer George Fenneman.

Fenneman, best known as the straight man on Groucho Marx' "You Bet Your Life," TV show, will be a straight man to a panel of high school editors at the Friday night banquet of the Conference.

The editors plan to quiz Fenneman on his experiences in radio and television and his assignments with such notables as Orson Welles, Dean Martin, Jerry Lewis, Abbott and Costello, and Jane Russell.

The TV man will join some 60 other journalists, teachers, printers, newspapermen, public relations men and experts in scholastic journalism who will conduct meetings for an expected 800 staff members of high school yearbooks and newspapers and their advisers.

Registration for the two-day meeting, which is sponsored by the Oregon Scholastic Press and the University's school of journalism, will start at 10 a.m. Friday, Oct. 7, in the Erb Memorial Union. Meetings start at noon and end just before the Saturday Oregon - San Jose football game, which delegates may attend.

Separate sessions will be held on newspaper and yearbook work. Special meetings are planned for advisers and on Saturday morning they will hold their annual Oregon Association of Journalism Advisers meeting.

Information on fees and housing may be obtained from the school of journalism, University of Oregon, Eugene. Registration deadline is Sept. 27.
