The forked bar connecting at the wheel core was designed for a front wheel and didn't fit properly. Otherwise, the arrangement operates with "fairly good ease". Reports say the girls were always using the boys' bicycles, so the "mechanics" decided to construct for them another means of transportation. The tandem, complete with two seats and three wheels, is made from two girl's bikes. Richard said it was originally his father's idea, but the "kids" decided to build it. Although it is "pretty easy" to operate, use has been reserved for "going to the store" and "having fun,"—not for riding to school. A special "swivel" addition in the middle allows control when turning. They say it took only a day to build "Bloody Mary," named for its bright red color. So far as they know, it is the only one of its kind locally.

4-H Fair Stock Sold at Portland

Portland — (UPI) — Four-H market livestock exhibited at this year's state fair was sold on the open market at the Portland Union Stock Yards Friday.

The animals were trucked up Thursday night from Salem.

Prices were up over 1959 prices for hogs but cattle and lamb levels were below last year. Top price for a prime steer was \$28.50 a hundredweight. Last year the top was \$29.50.

At that, prices for 4-H stock averaged about 50 cents per hundredweight above current Portland market quotations. S. and J. Meat company, Portland, bought the entire lot of 56 market hogs paying a top of \$19 a hundredweight.

Durno Defines Congressman's Job

Rogue River — Speaking on "The Role of a Congressman" at the Grange hall here Friday night, Republican congressional candidate Edwin R. Durno defined a congressman as "an agent between the people of his congressional district and Washington, whose function is to pay attention to the wishes and recommendations of the people, and have a vast knowledge of their problems."

Durno described the "poor condition" of the Brookings harbor and of the south jetties of the Siuslaw and Umpqua harbors as "examples of neglect."

He warned that lumbering, "this number one industry in Oregon — today and for generations to come — is being threatened from two sides." Besides areas being cut too fast to maintain a sustained yield, he said, "there are nearly a million acres of wilderness in danger of being 'ice-boxed' forever by being turned into a permanent primitive area." He added that some of it is bug-infested and should be cut, allowing for new growth.

"I am not against national parks, but they must not conflict with the economy of this state," Durno declared.

Flegel To Head Porter's Campaign

Eugene — Al Flegel, Roseburg, has been appointed chairman of Congress man Charles O. Porter's campaign committee, according to an announcement from Porter's office.

The Eugene Democrat is seeking his third congressional term.

Flegel stated, "Porter has represented the district ably in his two terms and I am happy to work for his re-election."

Flegel was mayor of Roseburg from 1948 to 1952 and has served two terms in the Oregon legislature. He is now a candidate for state senator.

Veterans Schedule Candidates' Night

Veterans of World War I, Medford Barracks 540, will sponsor a meeting Nov. 3, allowing both Republican and Democratic candidates to discuss political issues.

Pat Graham, 175 Jeanette st., Medford, has been named chairman of the project. At the meeting, candidates running for city, county, state

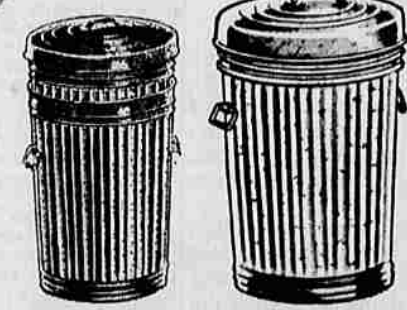
