Local Men Attend OSC Short Course

Corvallis—A record group of 160 county assessors and real estate appraisers from throughout Oregon—including six from Jackson county—are enrolled at Oregon State college this week in the fifth annual state appraisal short course.

The course is sponsored jointly by the state tax commission and OSC to provide a continuous training program for appraisers and to help bring about greater uniformity in valuation of real property throughout the state.

Special emphasis is being given this year to appraisal of residential property in, or adjacent to, commercial areas and to effect of new farming techniques on the valuation of farm buildings. Practice appraisals are a part of the course work.

Martin D. Miller, Chicago realtor and former assessor of Cook county, Ill., is one of the course leaders. Members of the state tax commission and the OSC staff also are instructors.

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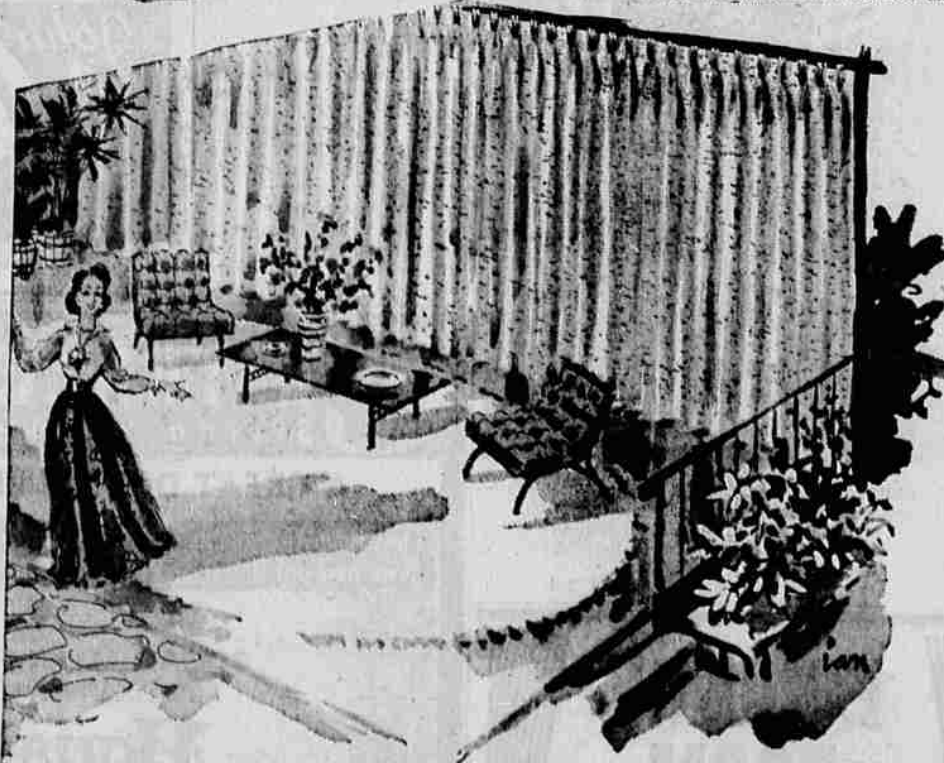
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
