New County Agent Hired to Handle Backyard Gardens

Because of increased demands on the county agent's office, John W. McLoughlin, 25, has been hired as the new Jackson county urban garden agent.

The work, which really started with the World War II victory gardens, will include assistance with local gardening problems. Essentially his job will be the organized dissemination of gardening information.

McLoughlin plans to do this by the use of such features as pruning demonstrations, lawn meetings and through garden clubs.

Previously Don Berry and Clifford Cordy have handled the local garden problems. This has been found to be time consuming, especially since the office is geared primarily for commercial interests.

But garden counseling of this type is important, Cordy said. A study, not in this local area, showed that home owners spend an average of \$80 per year on sprays, fertilizers and other garden supplies.

In this respect, backyard gardening is a big business, Cordy said. McLoughlin comes to the office after three years in the

United States Coast Guard, the past 2½ years of which he was stationed in Astoria.

He graduated from Rutgers university with a major in ornamental horticulture and floriculture. Other experience includes experimental greenhouse work at the university.

The board of Directors of the Medford YMCA Tuesday elected two new members to fill vacancies.

Gerald Scannell, Medford, was elected and will serve as a member of the family program committee.

Red China Rejects American Demand

Tokyo - (AP) - Communist China today rejected as "colossal interference" in its internal affairs a new American demand for the release of five imprisoned Americans. The rejection was broadcast by Peiping Radio, which said "the people of China can never allow such deeds." The Americans, all serving terms of from 15 years to life for alleged espionage, are: Bishop James E. Walsh, Cumberland, Md.; former government employee John T. Downey, New Britain, Conn.; and Richard Fecteau, Lynn, Mass.; and businessmen Robert McCann, Altadena, Calif., and Hugh F. Redmond Jr., Yonkers, N.Y.

Sales Promoter To Handle Reduction Sale

The promotion is scheduled to begin Friday and continue throughout next week.
