Eastern Oregon Target of GOP With Hatfield Leading Parade

Republicans concentrated their campaign guns on Eastern Oregon today. Democrats move into that area in force Sunday.

Gov. Mark Hatfield, accompanied by GOP 2nd district congressional candidate Ron Phair, scheduled court-house step speeches at La Grande, Ontario, Heppner, Condon and Kinzua today. On Saturday they plan to be in John Day and Moro.

Major state Democratic candidates will visit The Dalles, Condon, Hermiston, Pendleton, La Grande, Baker, Ontario, Nyssa, Vale, Burns, Seneca, John Day, Prineville, Bend, Redmond and Madras on a four-day swing starting Sunday. On Sunday Sept. 25 the Democratic candidates will tour the Oregon coast on a three-day trip.

Maurine in Corvallis
Mrs. Maurine Neuberger, the Democratic nominee for the U.S. Senate, spoke in Corvallis today at the 21st annual meeting of the Oregon Turkey Improvement association. She said the prime object of farm programs for the 1960s should be to get surpluses "out of the storage bins and onto the dinner table."

Mrs. Neuberger said she favored early congressional action on a "two-price" wheat program. She said this would open the way for use of surplus wheat for poultry and livestock feed purposes.
She said a 60 per cent decline in 10 years in the Oregon turkey industry was largely a result of freight rate, market and low-cost feed advantages in other areas.
