Groundbreaking Ceremony Set by 1st Church of God

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the first unit of the First Church of God building will be held Sunday at 2:30 p.m. at Crater Lake ave. and Roberts rd.

The Rev. T. O. Satterfield, former pastor of the church, will turn the first shovel of dirt signifying the start of construction. The Rev. Dwight Brown, Portland, state director of evangelism and consultant of church architecture, will be the speaker for the dedication ceremonies.

In charge of the event will be Roy E. Hoover, chairman of the building committee, and the Rev. W. E. Martin, pastor of the church.

Construction will begin first on the center section of the building (the row of windows in the drawing) which will later be the Sunday school department.

Church Sold

The fellowship hall in this section will be used for worship services early in January, Mr. Martin said. He explained that the present church building at Haven and Holly sts. has been sold and the congregation must be out of the building no later than Nov. 31. The building was sold to the Unity Center of Medford.

Mr. Martin said that some arrangements will have to be made for services during December.

The first unit to be constructed will be L-shaped, 92 by 78 feet and include 4,300 square feet. It will house, in addition to the fellowship hall, 10 classrooms, a pastor's office and restrooms.

Church Building

Immediately following the completion of the Sunday school unit, construction will begin on the actual church building. It will be 40 by 96 feet and include the narthex, sanctuary, balcony and at least two classrooms. The two units will be valued at \$80,000 and include 8,500 square feet of space.

The sanctuary will seat 250 persons with 100 in the balcony.

The Sunday school unit will be of colored block masonry and the church of vertical cedar siding and masonry trim. The units will be on the three acres which front on Crater Lake ave. The entire lot is about 6 1/2 acres.

Preliminary plans for the building were prepared by Al G. and T. Medford architect. Volunteer labor will be used to build the church under the direction of George Cramer, it was reported.

Catholics To Observe Catechetical Sunday Here

It is customary in many parishes to enroll new CCD members on this day and to set up a public display of various project materials. However, enrollment date for Sacred Heart parish unit of CCD has been set for Wednesday, Oct. 5. The church ceremonies will be followed by a reception.

All Roman Catholics in the Portland area have been reminded by Archbishop Edward D. Howard of the work of the CCD and to participate in its projects.
