John C. Shaw has left for Chicago where he will attend Northwestern university under a four-year scholarship awarded by the university. He will be a student in the school of technology.

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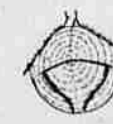
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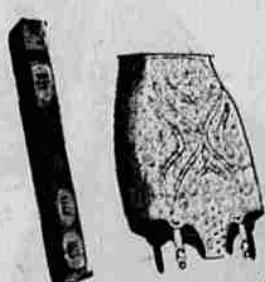
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
