FBI Fugitive Sought for Murder Case Questioning

Denver - (UPI) - The Federal Bureau of Investigation Saturday labeled as "pure rumor" a report that one of the FBI's 10 most wanted men sought unofficially in connection with the death of Colorado brewer Adolph Coors III was seen in southwest Colorado.

But local authorities across the southwest issued an alert for a car driven by a man reported fitting the description of Joseph Corbett, Jr., 31, after the man was seen in four southwest Colorado towns.

"If we believed the report was true, we'd be down there en masse," said J. Scott Werner, agent in charge of the Denver FBI office. "It's pure rumor." The sheriff's office at Cortez said a woman called in the report Friday morning that she saw a man who looked like Corbett's picture on FBI posters. Officers refused to identify the woman.

Corbett was linked to the Feb. 9 disappearance of the wealthy Colorado brewer, whose remains were found last week near a remote mountain dump southwest of Denver, because he dropped from sight the day after Coors vanished.

Maurine Urges Buyers' Protection

Portland - (UPI) - Mrs. Maurine Neuberger, candidate for the U.S. Senate, today urged the protection of consumers from hidden finance charges by enactment of federal legislation requiring full disclosure of interest rates.

Mrs. Neuberger, speaking at a Portland Teacher's Credit Union luncheon, said "With more than \$52 billion of consumer debt outstanding, legislation is needed to strip away misleading and deceptive methods of stating interest rates and price of credit."
