Cards Trip SF Gridders

San Francisco - (UPI) - The San Francisco Forty Niners get down to business next Sunday with the New York Giants after a so-so exhibition series.

King Hill, who once played a big role as Rice was blasting Stanford a couple of years ago, passed for one touchdown and got another started Sunday while leading the St. Louis Cardinals to a 24-17 victory over coach Red Hickey's troopers. It was their third straight exhibition loss and left the Forty Niners with a 3-3 pre-season record.

San Francisco held a 17-14 edge after the first two periods but were blanked during the second half as the Cards scored 10 more points to cinch the game.

The go ahead tally came in the third period when Frank Mestnik, a rookie from Marquette, scored from the two yard line. The drive started after Bobby Towns, another first year man from Georgia, intercepted a pass by Y. A. Tittle.

It was the third straight loss for San Francisco, and Hickey commented after the game that his team hasn't played like it was ready for the regular season.

"We've got a few individuals resting on their laurels," he said, "declining to name names. They'll have to be broken of this attitude."

Defending Northwest conference champion Willamette defeated the University of Puget Sound, 27-26, in one of the key games Saturday involving Oregon small college teams. All the contests were non-conference affairs.

A five-yard touchdown pass from Tommy Lee to Stan Solomon with no time showing on the clock provided the Bearcats with their narrow triumph.

Lewis and Clark, also of the Northwest Conference, trounced Portland State by a 40-7 score.

Halfback Gary Grill scored three touchdowns and end Dick Miller caught two scoring passes from quarterback Royce McDaniel to provide Lewis and Clark with five of its six TDs.

Sacramento State used an effective passing attack to down Southern Oregon of the OCC, 39-14, in the annual Myrtle Bowl Shrine game.

In other games involving Oregon small college teams, Humboldt State whipped Linfield 33-0; Oregon Tech stopped Westminster, 22-19; Whitman rolled over Eastern Oregon 45-14, and Pacific University upset Pacific Lutheran, 20-12.

Two first half touchdowns passed by Bob Light provided Pacific with its winning margin. Light connected on a 31-yard pass TD play to Marvin Rueck and hit John Hadley on a 14-yarder for the second score.

Washington - (UPI) - Willard Rhodes of Seattle, Wash., owner of the hydroplane Miss Thriftway, is expected to protest the finish of the 29th President Cup Regatta in which Miss Detroit was placed first ahead of his craft.

Miss Detroit, owned and driven by Chuck Thompson of the motor city, and Miss Thriftway ended three laps of competition on the Potomac River Sunday in a first place tie with 925 points each.

However, Miss Detroit was declared the winner on elapsed time. She completed the 45.15-mile heats in 28:45.9 compared to Miss Thriftway's clocking of 27:05.6.

Rhodes planned to base his protest on the result of the final heat. His craft first was declared the heat winner but later was placed second behind Nitrogen, owned by Samuel Du Pont of Wilmington, Del.

Beman Chosen On Links Team
New York - (UPI) - Four players, including the new National Amateur champion, Deane Beman, have been named to represent the United States in the Eisenhower Trophy golf competition at Ardmore, Pa., Sept. 28-Oct. 1.

Those who will join Beman, of Bethesda, Md., in quest of the World Amateur team championship are Bob Gardner of New York, Bill Hyndman III of Philadelphia and Jack Nicklaus of Columbus, Ohio. Nicklaus was the 1959 Amateur champ and Gardner was runner-up to Beman this year.

Totten P. Heffelfinger of Minneapolis will be non-playing captain, and alternates for the team are Charley Coe of Oklahoma City and Tommy Aaron of Gainesville, Ga.

A field of 127 golfers from 32 nations are expected to compete.

Mickey Wright Record Breaker
Memphis, Tenn. - (UPI) - Blonde Mickey Wright, a hard-hitting par-buster from San Diego, Calif., owned the 1960 Memphis Women's Open golf trophy today as a reward for the best 72 holes ever shot on the ladies professional golf circuit.

Her birdie four on the final hole gave her a 278 and sliced one stroke off the old ladies PGA record, set by Mary Lena Faulk of Thomasville, Ga., in the 1956 St. Petersburg Open.

Among the new pro stars were Billy Cannon and Jack Spikes, two of last season's college headlines; some lesser-known rookies like Chuck Shonta, Austin Gonsoulin and Dave Smith, and a full-blooded Cherokee Indian named Johnny Pycatt.

And, of course, once again "old men" George Blanda and Johnny Trippucka ran wild like they never did in the National Football league.

Denver Surprises
The surprising Denver Broncos, whose pre-season prospects looked poor, took over first place in the Western division of the AFL with a rallying 27-21 victory over the Buffalo Bills Sunday. And the Houston Oilers grabbed the Eastern division lead by beating the Los Angeles Chargers, 38-28.

On Saturday night, Shontz picked up a fumble just as the clock was running out and raced 25 yards for a touchdown that gave the Boston Patriots a 28-24 victory over the New York Titans.

Ernie Vossler Carling Victor

Tacoma, Wash. - (UPI) - Ernie Vossler, a pro who has had his best luck farther south, today had an "up north" victory under his belt in the Carling Open golf tournament.

Vossler finished the 72-hole test at the Fircrest Golf club course here Sunday with a 272 score and first prize money of \$3,500.

Vossler, and Dave Marr, Houston, were one shot off the pace Sunday when the pros started off. Paul Harney, Worcester, Mass., held a 203 and Vossler and Marr were at 204.

Harney, former winner of the Carling and in line for a \$5,000 bonus given to a repeater, had to settle for second place at 273 and \$2,300 in prize money.

Ken Venturi, Palo Alto, Calif., and Hebert finished at 275. Each picked up \$1,050, while Fred Hawkins, El Paso, Tex.; Bill Casper Jr., Apple Valley, Calif.; and Bob Duden, Portland, Ore., each had 276 and took home \$1,200.

Robertson Signs With Cincinnati

St. Mary's Footballers Overcome Sacred Heart

St. Mary's high, languid for more than one half as it began its District 5B football title defense here Saturday night, sparked up in the third quarter and went on to whip Sacred Heart of Klamath Falls 26 to 6 in a penalty-marred fray.

The Crusaders moved to a touchdown the second time they got their hands on the ball in the first half but it took an early third period tying TD by the Klamath team to make the Medford parochials really go to work.

They bounced right out to break the tie and then gained their third touchdown just as the third period ended. A fourth canto tally iced the tussle.

Jim Calhoun rolled out for a seven-yard run for SM's first TD. He hit Andre Knutson on a 15-yard pass play for the second score. Knutson broke over right tackle, cut to the left, and with the help of a key block by Fred Lucas ran 45 yards for Touchdown No. 3. Calhoun, who rolled around end five yards for the fourth TD, kicked two conversion tries.

Portland Open Practice Held

Portland - (UPI) - First practice rounds for golf professionals who will compete this week in the \$27,500 Portland Open were held today at the Portland Golf club.

Most of the pros were scheduled to arrive here following Sunday's final round of the Carling Open at Tacoma, Wash., won by Ernie Vossler.

A 36-hole pro-am tourney, with \$5,000 in prize money, will be held Tuesday and Wednesday.

The open will run Thursday through Sunday with a field of 150, including 10 amateurs, scheduled to tee off in the meet's first round.

The field will be trimmed to 60 after the initial 36 holes. Heading of the list of big-game players in the tournament is Arnold Palmer, winner of this year's U.S. Open and Masters.

Palmer is only about \$2,000 short of breaking Ted Kroll's one-year earning mark of \$72,835.63.

Ex-Teammate Haunts Giants

Chicago - (UPI) - Trade 'em away and they come back to haunt you.

Ernie Broglio, whom the San Francisco Giants dealt to St. Louis after the 1958 season, won his 20th game of the season Sunday while pitching the Cardinals to a 4-3 victory over the fifth-place team.

Broglio, now 20-7, struck out eight and gave up only four hits but three were for extra bases. Ed Bressoud socked a two run homer in the fifth inning. Willie Mays tripled in the sixth and Joe Amalfitano opened the ninth with a double.

It was Broglio's 15th win in his last 18 decisions but his first of the year over the Giants.

Sacred Heart, helped by an SM roughness penalty, moved 43 yards for its only touchdown. Mike Holland's pass interception set up the drive and elusive Jerry Denault went around end for the last seven yards. Shan Britton's conversion run was short.

St. Mary's outgained the Trojans 286 to 77 in total net scrimmage yards. The Klamath club crossed 53 yards in the second half but were set back for losses totaling 38. That netted them 15 for the half. The Crusaders made 227 yards on the ground and 59 in the air to 77 rushing and 12 passing by the Sacred Heart 11.

First downs favored St. Mary's 11 to eight.

Officials called 12 penalties for 140 yards on St. Mary's and six for 50 on the Trojans. The Medford team got on the way to its first touchdown when SH's Doug Murray muffed a Knutson punt and Crusaders swarmed on the ball on the Trojan 36. Six plays were required.

St. Mary's went 61 yards off the SH kick-off for its second marker. Knutson had a run of 31 yards but clipping cost 15 yards of the gain. This was made up a bit later by a Trojan roughness penalty.

Bad Center Snap

Stage was set for the third TD when Murray's SH punt went out only 11 yards to the Trojan 45. Knutson touched down on the next play. SM took advantage of a bad center snap which lost 18 yards for the Klamath club. St. Mary's Pete Naumes fell on the ball on the Trojan 20. Four plays later Calhoun went over the goal.

In the late fourth period, with St. Mary's setting up a screen, Alex Mete returned a punt 51 yards to the goal. But clipping was called, nullifying a score. SM was given the ball on the SH 46. Seven plays later it was on the Trojan four-yard line and the final horn sounded.

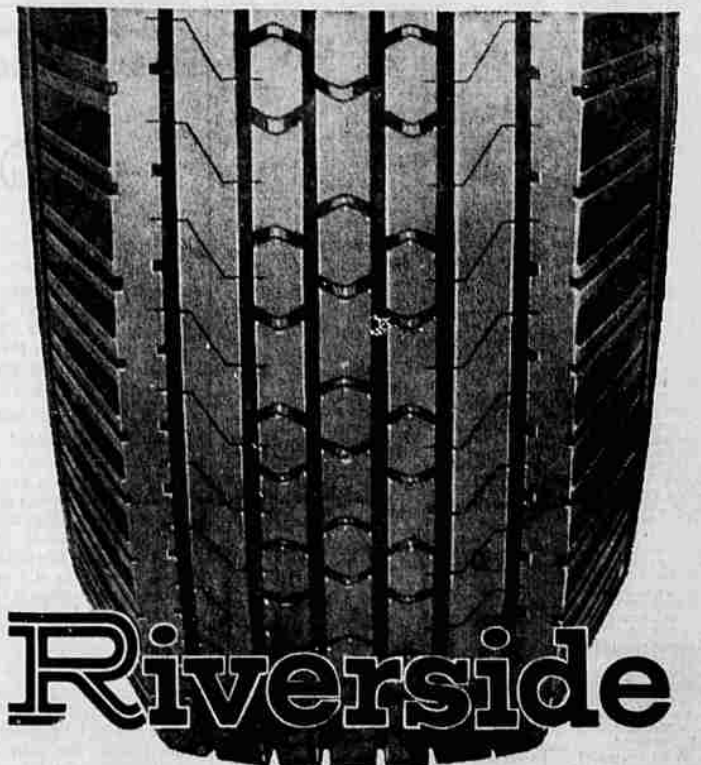
