CRATER-GP HERE
Crater high varsity footballers will have two games this fall at the Medford stadium. They meet Medford high here on Friday, Oct. 7, and Grants pass on Saturday, Oct. 22. The Comet-GP scrap was originally set for the previous night at Central Point. Medford plays Reno, Nev., here on Oct. 21.

CROSS COUNTRY
There will be district qualifying for the first time this year for the state high school cross country meet. This procedure certainly should cut down the congestion which has plagued the meets in the past.

Number of teams and individuals qualifying for state will depend on the number of schools taking part in district meets. Districts in which three teams or less compete will qualify the first two individuals and the first place team. Those with four to six teams in the district meet will qualify the first five runners and the top two teams. In district meets of seven to nine teams, the first eight runners and top two teams will get state spots and, in districts with 10 or more teams entered, the first 10 men plus the first four teams go to state.

Portland - (UPI) - Defending state A-1 champion Medford polled 79 out of 80 possible points to top the Journal coaches' poll as Oregon's top-ranked high school football power for the second straight week.

Medford last week drubbed Marshfield 34-0 after opening its season with a 38-7 win over Arcata, Calif. Jefferson of Portland was ranked second and Klamath Falls moved up to third place. North Salem, which

finished Klamath Falls 7-7, was fourth and Madision of Portland was fifth. Marshfield slipped to sixth place. WILLAMINA LEADS

Willamina again was in first place in the A-2 poll, followed by Seaside. Central, Vale, Bandon, Myrtle Point and Mac-Hi, Coquille, St. Francis of Eugene and Estacada.

The association comprises Oregon, Washington, Idaho and British Columbia, and more than 60 members attended.

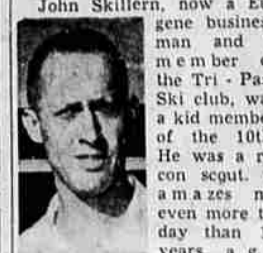

Guerrri Basta! That means "enough war."
That is the word I bring back from the area where our 10th Mountain division made its initial attack some 16 years ago.

What do the politicians know about war, sitting back in their capitals? The airplane pilot has exciting personal combat. Even the infantry is different. After all of these years I remember that there was hardly a house in northern Italy that did not have at least one corner shot out, or perhaps the roof gone; people were in rags, and children begging for the left-overs from a poor G. I. meal.

Now there is stock in the barn and chickens in the yard. They are comfortable, well-dressed and sit overlooking the rugged mountains with a glass of light rose-colored wine. Little wonder that they say, "Guerrri Basta!"

We drove from Florence to Pistoia, up the steep mountain roads to a mountain village named Parette Terme, then to the many hamlets that were "home" to us during the war.

One of the most beautiful spots is Lizzano in Belvedere. It was in shambles 16 years ago, now a lovely mountain resort. The people are friendly.

I visited in the farmhouse where I slept over 16 years ago. This stone cottage overlooks the bastion that was given the name "Riva Ridge." "The closest friends of Brigitte Bardot no longer have any doubts: B.B. is going to get a divorce. It is certain," said the tabloid Paris-Jour.
