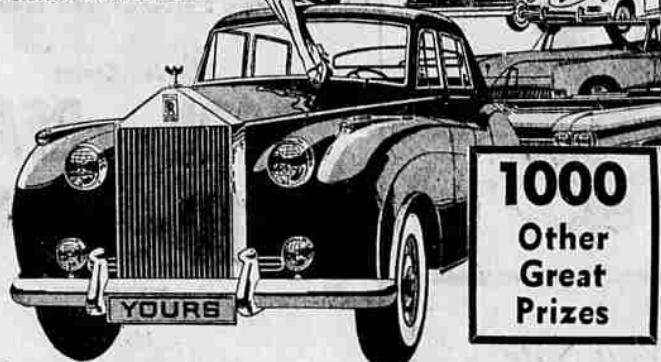

West Germans Interested in Future, Miss Taylor Reports

Generally the people of West Germany are deeply interested in the future, although they may not talk about it unless questioned, according to DeAnne Taylor, Medford High school senior.

Miss Taylor, a 1960 summer-exchange student from Medford to West Berlin, spoke before a committee meeting of the American Field service when some 38 local AFS participants met at the Rogue Valley Country club.

The student pointed out she sensed a feeling of 'national pride' in the people with whom she came in contact last summer. Without generalizing, she contended that many West Berliners, as well as Europeans in general, know much more about the United States and international affairs than Americans do. She emphasized that the Europeans generally do not express themselves as freely as do Americans.

Assigned to Germany

In speaking for her three-months experience living in West Berlin, Miss Taylor said that at least 40 students from Oregon, Washington and California were assigned to Germany for the summer. The group sailed from Montreal, Quebec, in early June and returned home with more than 1,000 other Amer-

ican students in late August. Miss Taylor said she had visited famous breweries in Germany "several times," as they were "very interesting."

She compared West Berlin, in many ways, to New York City. East Berlin, however, produced an entirely different impression on her. She noted that activity was slight and rarely did one see many people or cars at one time.

In comparing teen-age life, Miss Taylor said her German "sister," for example, didn't date as much as American youths do. In addition, while on dates the Europeans would be more likely

to attend a concert, than a movie or dance.

The student ambassador told the group those she met while in West Berlin asked many "personal questions," the things that characterize Americans. The Germans realized they had been subjected to false ideas, and wanted to know the truth.

Basically, the West Berliners were interested in the visitors as students and as representatives of the United States, Miss Taylor continued.

As an example of misunderstanding, she noted the fact that many Europeans fail to comprehend distance and the time necessary for travel in the U.S. It was not uncommon for someone to ask, "I have a pen pal in Wisconsin, do you know him?"

This was the senior's first formal appearance in relating her experiences since her return home. She is now scheduled to speak for church and youth groups, as well as Parent-Teacher associations.

The American Field service has for the past several years sponsored one student from Medford to live with a foreign family during the summer. Applications for next summer will be accepted from local high school juniors sometime in November or December.

Fondness for Sleep Breaks Up Marriage
