**Served in Army**  
Hall first started writing seriously in 1948. From 1941-46, he served in the Army as a chief warrant officer. After discharge, he went back to his old college as a visiting professor and taught at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. Later at the University of Iowa, he was awarded a doctor of philosophy degree in literary studies.

He took his first regular teaching position at Cornell University in Ithaca, N.Y., and came to Oregon in 1953.

His poems started appearing in Poetry Magazine and Sewanee Review, a literary publication. A collection of short stories, with R. V. Cassill and Herbert Gold, was published under the title "Fifteen By Three." His first novel, "Not By The Door," and a text book on the short story again put the Hall name before the public.

**Motorcycle Racing**  
"Racers To The Sun," is a novel about motorcycle racing, set in his home state of Ohio. It treats the demands of society as against the individual, and gives Hall a chance to dramatize some of the effects of competition in America.

Hall is head of the university's creative writing department and director of Oregon's student-drawing Summer Academy of Contemporary Arts.

This summer he succeeded in bringing to the campus some of the best-known figures in the modern arts. Among them were Tyrone Guthrie, director of the Old Vic Theater, London, England, and California-based cartoonist Virgil (Vip) Partch. The Oregon professor is spending his one year of sabbatical leave on Balboa Island, Calif., with his wife and five children.

He's not quite sure how he'll spend all his time but reports "some of it will be spent writing."

While he is away, his place at Oregon will be taken by Earlo Birney, Canadian poet and Chaucer scholar from the University of British Columbia, and by Ralph Salisbury, poet and short story writer from Drake university, Iowa.

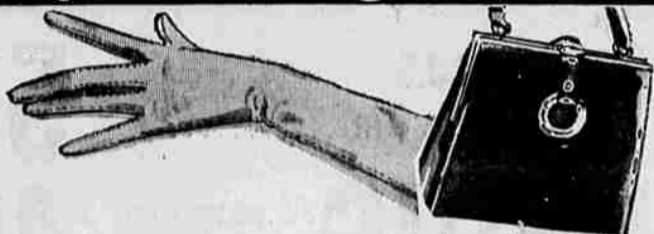
