Porter, Morse Call For Al Sarena Probe

Congressman Charles O. Porter has asked United States Attorney General William P. Rogers for an investigation and action to regain for the U. S. the value of timber removed from the Al Sarena Mining claims, and to protect 2 million board feet of timber still standing on the claims.

Porter was supported in his demand by Oregon Sen. Wayne L. Morse, whose backing was sought by Porter.

In a telegram to Rogers, Porter said that 6,617,000 board feet of timber have been removed from the claims near Trail in the Rogue River National forest.

Strong Case—Porter said the "recorded sale of Al Sarena timber in the Rogue River National forest to Steve O. Wilson company of Medford, disclosed last week for the first time, seems to make strong case for voiding patents issued by the Al Sarena Mining company."

The Portland Reporter last week, in a copyrighted story, said the claims had been sold to Wilson, and that no minerals had been mined from the claims, although patents had been granted in 1954.

Morse told Porter that he had attacked the sale in an Aug. 27 Senate speech as "further proof that this (Al Sarena) transaction was a give-away of the people's timber under the guise of mining claims."

The Oregon senator said "I am calling upon both the department of the interior and the department of justice to take whatever steps can be taken at this late date to protect the public interest."

Morse said in his Senate speech there was nothing improper about Wilson's buying the timber since it had become private property by what he called the administration's "give-away."

Porter's telegram to Rogers was read at an open house Wednesday evening at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Mark Norton, Phoenix.

Expresses Support—At the open house, attended by an "overflow crowd," Porter also expressed his support of the Forand bill, providing medical care for the elderly through the Social Security administration, and he deplored the unworkability of the Medicare plan endorsed by his opponent, Dr. Edwin Durno, Republican seeking the fourth congressional district seat.

Pointing to the slump in the building industry, Porter said that housing starts are down 17 per cent from the first eight months of last year because of the Republican
