

Raiders Encounter Whitman Saturday

Ashland — "We have made some defensive and offensive changes and we should be near peak strength with a few exceptions," said Al Akins as his Southern Oregon college Red Raiders prepared for the battle with Whitman tomorrow night on Fuller field here in Ashland.

A night practice was held Thursday with scrimmaging the main subject to get the team in readiness. The Raiders have some new defensive men that have turned out in the past week who were getting a chance to play.

Quarterback John Buck has been moved to the left slot-back on offense while Doug Olsen and Gordy Carrigan will share the signal-calling. Carrigan, however, will be the starting end on the right flank.

Buck will also play line-backer on defense where he was a standout last year. Akins feels this will strengthen both units in their effort to win a ball game after a pair of opening defeats.

Whitman, too, has been moaning about injuries to their backs, but coach John Thomassen has hopes of his first unit backfield being ready this week. Two of his backfield quartet were shaken up in the game with Central

Washington last week and saw little action. Akins continues to keep quiet on the idea of some new offensive formations in an effort to shake up the visiting Missionaries. He grants that his boys have been working with them, but he does not say they will be used.

Jess Munyon, the starting left tackle, has been named to handle the kickoff chores this week while frosh Lynn Knight will attempt the extra points and Tony "the Tiger" Brauner will do the punting besides being the offensive left guard.

St. Mary's Will Meet Glendale

St. Mary's High of Medford, a Class B performer, takes on A-2 Glendale on Saturday night in a non-league football ruckus at the Medford stadium.

The Pirates of Glendale were scouted last week and as a result Coach Bill McKibbin has given special emphasis in drills of the past few days to pass defense. He's changed some alignments in preparation for the test.

The Crusaders are not discounting the Glendale ground operation while girding air defenses. Pirate forward will will outweigh 176-pounds per man to 162. Backs Jack Berline and Monty McLoughlin make the Glendale backfield go. Berline is the passer.

Prior to the Bonanza mix a week ago, illness plagued the Crusaders. Coach McKibbin indicated that SM pretty well has shaken off the bug. Dick Evans, halfback whose back was injured in the season opener, still will miss the Pirate game.

Evans is expected to return to full scale drills next Monday. He saw very brief contact yesterday.

Possible starters for SM on offense Saturday are Paul Elliott and Dan Jacobson, ends; Marv McGee and Pat Stinson, tackles; Brian Von Buskirk and Jerry Vakoc, guards; Mike Stinson, center, and Jim Calhoun, Alex Mete, Andre Knutson and Fred Lucas, backs.

For defense McKibbin may first call on Elliott and McGee, ends; Vakoc and Dan Roush, tackles; Van Buskirk, middle guard; Dave Lowry, Lucas, Joe Kaiser and Bill Smith, linebacksers, and Calhoun and Mete, halfbacks.

The Dallas Cowboys, a grab bag team that made an impressive thought losing debut in the National Football league, shoot for their first victory tonight against the Philadelphia Eagles in the opener of a nine-game week end program for the two pro leagues.

By night fall Sunday it's likely there will be only three undefeated teams left in the NFL after only two weeks of competition.

Six of the clubs which won their openers last week end are pitted against one another Sunday. The champion Baltimore Colts are at home against the Chicago Bears in the league's top game; the St. Louis Cardinals entertain the New York Giants and the Cleveland Browns are host to the Pittsburgh Steelers.

In the two other NFL games on Sunday, the Detroit Lions play their season-opener against the Packers at Green Bay and the San Francisco Forty-Niners are at home against the Los Angeles Rams.

In the young American Football league, where there are no unbeaten teams left after three weeks of play, the No. 1 game finds the Dallas Texans at home against the New York Titans. The Denver Broncos, who played their first three games on the road, make their home debut against the Oakland Raiders, and the Buffalo Bills are at home against the Los Angeles Chargers.

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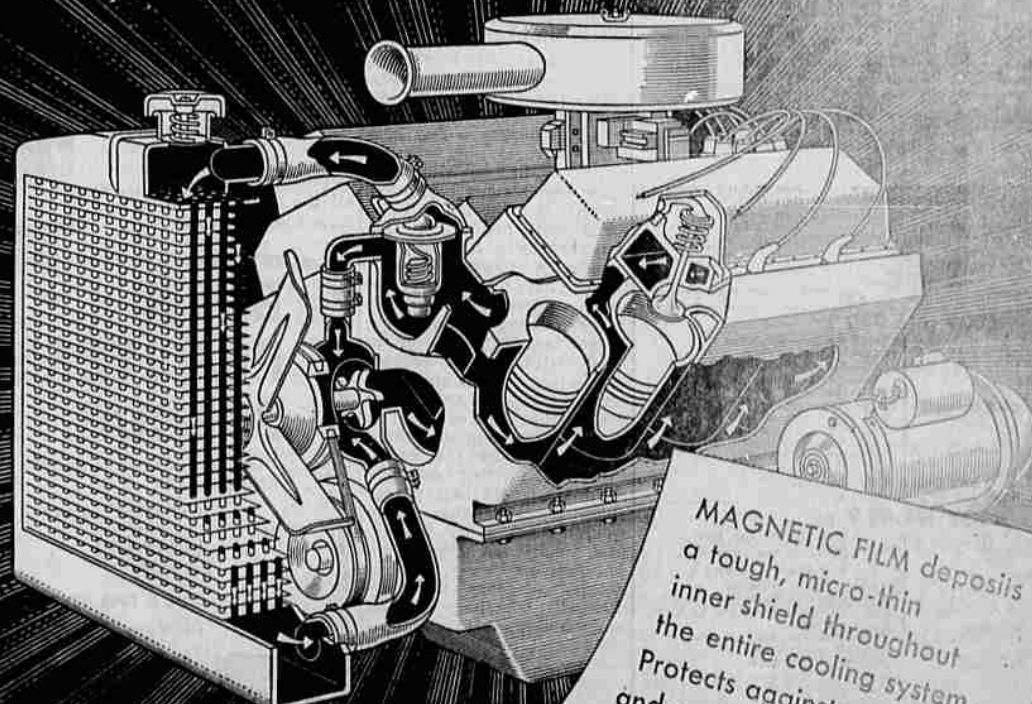
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
