

Policy Change for Slash Burning Is Noted by Agencies

A change in the policy of slash burning in this area has been announced by forest protective agencies here.

Curtis Nesheim, southwest district warden of the state department of forestry, and Robert Torheim, fire control officer for the Rogue River National forest, said the new policy has been put into effect "to insure the safe burning of logging debris and thereby prevent unnecessary damage to forest lands."

Torheim said the policy will apply on private land within the national forest.

Check Inspector

Permits, under the new policy, will not be issued from district offices, Nesheim noted. The procedure which will be followed when weather

conditions permit logging slash burning will be:

The operator should first check with the forest inspector, the Medford office, or the Grants Pass office and indicate when he will be ready to burn slash. The state department of forestry will then indicate what the operator will need in manpower and equipment to safely burn the particular area in question.

A state man will be assigned to meet the operator at the slash area at an appointed time for burning. The forest warden will issue the permit, provided the operator has the required men and equipment on the job, and the weather is right.

All terms of the burning permits must be adhered to at all times, Nesheim noted, and these terms will be explained to the operator at the time the permit is issued.

Nesheim said anyone burning without a permit, or violating any of the provisions of the permit, will be cited to appear in court.

The district warden said that in the past "most of our trouble with escaped slash fires has been due to the fires being left unattended. Continuous and adequate patrol must be maintained to insure that the fire will not escape the area that has been prepared for burning."

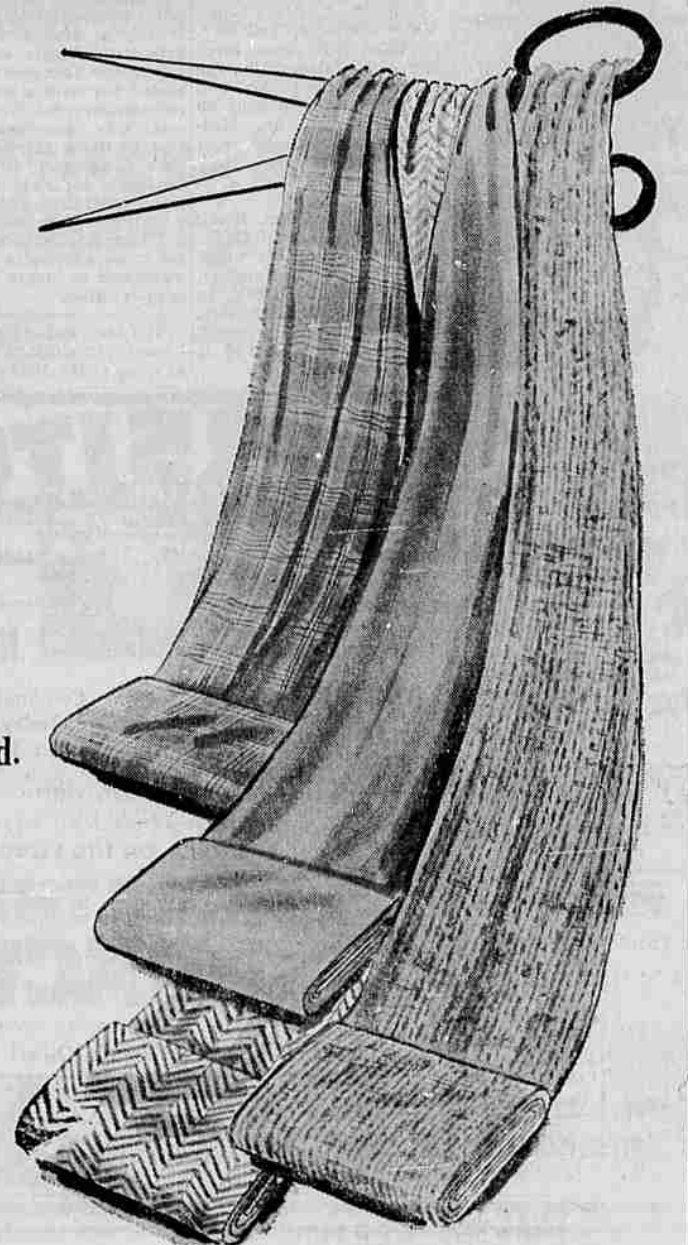

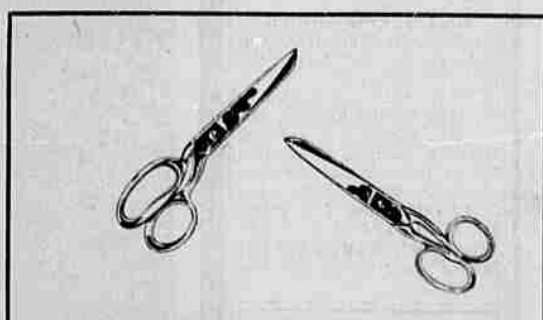

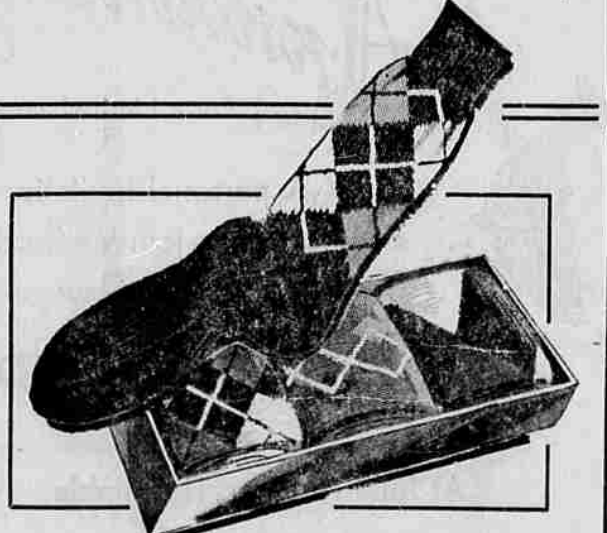
