Water Bond Issue Gets Cool Reception in So. California

Sacramento—The proposed \$1.75 billion water bond issue on the Nov. 8 ballot encountered a cool reception in the powerful Metropolitan Water District of Southern California.

The huge bond issue, if approved by California voters, would help pay for the transmission of surplus water from the northern mountain areas and the Sacramento-San Joaquin delta to the southland.

But at week's end, Gov. Edmund G. Brown and the MWD directors appeared hopelessly deadlocked on efforts to settle their dispute over the district's contract for water from the proposed state aqueduct project.

Directors To Meet
Directors said they would meet Oct. 11 to determine their position on the \$1.75 billion bond issue, which appears as Proposition 1 on the November ballot.

Chairman Joseph Jensen of the MWD set the deadline after a two-hour meeting with Brown at which there appeared virtually no hope of reconciling their differences over terms of the contract.

The biggest argument has been over the date the proposed pact would become effective. Jensen said his group continued to hold the position it would not approve any contract that would not become effective upon passage of the bond issue.

The governor has stated he would not allow the effective date of the contract to be prior to 90 days after the 1961 legislative session adjourns.

Seeks Agreement
Brown has been pushing for an early agreement on the water contract because of what he called an urgent need to execute a pact before the election.

The governor said that if the MWD did not approve his plans he would find it necessary to ask for approval of the multimillion-dollar bond issue without the district's support.

After a stormy session at the end of the week, the governor was questioned as to how long he expected negotiations to continue.

"We've got until Nov. 8 to work out a contract," he said. "But that's cutting it pretty short. I intend to do what I can to put this bond issue over—even without MWD's help."

Elsewhere, there were these developments:

Fruit fly: Orange county agriculture department workers said they were "more and more befuddled" because they haven't trapped any more Oriental fruit flies since finding two of the dreaded insects a month ago. A spokesman for

the department said that entomologists had been unable to explain the presence of just two of the flies. He said trapping procedures are continuing and are even being stepped up. After the two insects were discovered in an Anaheim orange orchard, a lone fly was found about 100 miles to the north, near Santa Barbara.

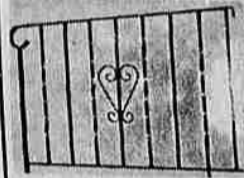
Water: The state department of water resources assured 15 northern California counties they would have all the water they need for the next century. Director Harvey O. Banks said this was the finding of a new investigation undertaken by the department. He said it was based on the probable full development of all natural resources during the next 80 years. The study covered the counties of Butte, Colusa, Glenn, Lake, Lassen, Modoc, Plumas, Shasta, Sierra, Siskiyou, Sutter, Tehama, Trinity, Yolo and Yuba.

Fire: Vandenberg Air Force Base provided Santa Maria with fire fighting foam because of possible danger of crashing missiles and aircraft. The city's fire chief, Harry Bell, said that "the Air Force feels there is some hazard since we are located so close to the base. With all the missile and aircraft traffic they have, they feel this foam would do the job in putting out any fire caused by airborne craft." Santa Maria is 15 miles southwest of the air base.

Death penalty: Gov. Edmund G. Brown urged members of the California State Bar to study ways to change the concepts of criminal law, especially in the field of the death penalty. Brown told

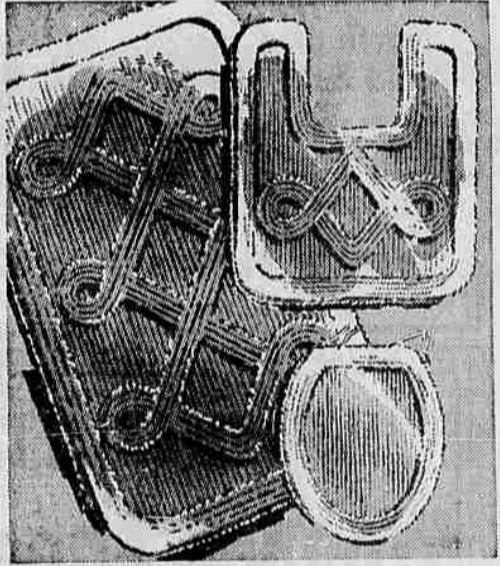
delegates to the 33rd annual bar convention in Los Angeles that such reforms were "long overdue" in light of modern developments in medicine and scientific research.
