Belle S. - We married too young. Bernard S. - There's no use crying about it.

Belle S. - I am one of those foolish teenage brides you hear about that is, I was a few years ago. Now I am 22 and am about to have my third child. I realize what a darn fool I've been. My parents wanted me to go to college or at least work a couple of years before getting married, but I wouldn't listen. Now I feel there is nothing ahead for me but babies and housework.

My husband has no sympathy or understanding of how hard things are for a woman. He never takes me out and begrudges every bit of help he gives me. I'm fed up!

Bernard S. - My wife has a washer, a freezer and a lot of other appliances women didn't have a generation ago. Yet they managed to raise families without complaining so much.

I do take Belle out occasionally, only we have to spend so much for the babysitter that we have to cut down on the money we spend on the occasion. Belle likes to do things up in style, and we just can't afford that. Incidentally, we do have two TV sets for home entertainment, and that's something our parents never had.

We made a mistake by marrying so young, but must we cry about it the rest of our lives?
