248 Complaints Answered by Dog Control Officer

Chris Hagler, Jackson county dog control officer, reported to the county court Friday that during September he answered 248 complaints.

His department picked up 85 dogs, and of these 22 were recovered by their owners and 26 found new homes. Eighty-five dogs were brought into the pound, he said.

Thirty-nine lost dogs were reported during September. Dogs destroyed during the month totaled 138. Cats destroyed totaled 56.

Hagler estimated that he received a total of 2,013 telephone calls on dog problems.

Dog License Fees

From Aug. 23 through Sept. 22, Hagler said his department collected \$181 in dog license fees. Boarding fees collected for animals impounded and returned to their owners totaled \$209.25. Total money turned into the dog control fund from dog licenses and pound fees for the month was \$379.50. Balance for the department is \$1,368.32, Hagler said.

On Sept. 23, the dog control officer turned in 22 names of dog owners whose pets ran at large. These may be fined \$10 each for the violation.

Hagler added that his department received one complaint of a wild ground squirrel which bit a small boy. A rabies examination was made of the animal and it was destroyed.

Hagler said he has received more complaints on dogs but not as many dogs biting children on school playgrounds.

Grants Pass Man Sentenced to Term

Guthrie Edwin Jones, 25, Grants Pass, was sentenced in Jackson county circuit court Friday to two years and 10 months in the Oregon Correctional Institution for burglary not in a dwelling.

Jones had waived right to a grand jury hearing and was arraigned on district attorney's information. His case was continued until Friday, when he pleaded guilty. He was charged with breaking into Dunham's, Inc., 1951 North Pacific highway, Aug. 21.

Thursday, Riley Filmore Jones, 21, also of Grants Pass, was arraigned on the same charge in circuit court. He waived right to a grand jury hearing. He pleaded guilty to district attorney's information. A pre-sentence report was ordered.

Walter D. Nunley was appointed attorney for James Harry Conlon, 38, of route 2, box 228G, Medford, charged with contributing to delinquency of a minor.

Typewriting Class Planned at Crater
