### 'Whim Trim' Newest Fad For Teeners Who Can Sew

New York—UPI—The newest teenage fad puts the girls to work at the sewing machine-making whim trims.

A whim trim, for the information of all squares, is a slightly gathered skirt made with two panels of fabric hanging from the front and back of the waistband. The panels can be worn down to provide an apron effect, or swing upward and buttoned at the shoulders to cover a blouse, much as a jumper does.

What provides the name, and the fun, is decorating the panels. Anything from old campaign buttons to the current steady's picture goes. And the zanier the decorations on the panels the better.

A couple of hundred teenagers participated in a whim trim competition in Tampa, Fla., last summer. Results ranged from an aquarium full of needlework fish to the map of the world with Africa seeming to float into the Pacific ocean—"I ran out of thread," said its creator.

In San Francisco, a group of girls trimmed skirts with mementos of their favorite recording artists. Van Cliburn received three neatly appliqued votes.

An Albany, N.Y., teenager collected subway and bus tokens from around the country, added a few dollars worth of foreign coins and became a kind of walking change booth.

In Washington, several girls appliqued caricatures of Nixon and Kennedy on panels. A Cleveland girl worked a small blackboard onto the panels, where she listed her social calendar. Idea was, the fellows would know without asking which of her evenings were free.

The design for the skirts originated with Indian Head Mills, Inc., which naturally wanted to push fabric usage. Simply produced a pattern and at least 35 stores in leading cities are running promotions of the whimsical skirts.

One of the most unusual trims came from a Sacramento, Calif., girl who attached

lipstick, compact, comb and even a small change holder to one panel.

School and extra-curricular activities have influenced some teen-agers. A language student from New York embroidered "Ici on Parle Français" across her skirt. The start of the football season promoted three Boston cheerleaders to use school pennants, surrounded by miniature footballs on thin silver chains.

Dating influenced some of the designs. One Syracuse, N.Y., girl embroidered one panel with a clock face, placing small snapshots of her "steady" where the numbers normally would go. Photographs from teen-age idols to the latest "crushes" have proved popular. But one young lady attached shots of old-time movie heroes including William Farnum, Rudolph Valentino and Francis X. Bushman.

Most ambitious perhaps was the Atlanta art student who copied the "Mona Lisa" right down to the inscrutable smile.
