World Outboard Records Fall

Oceanlake, Ore.—(UPI)—Five world records were broken in the Oregon Motor boat association's final meet of the season, which ended Sunday on Devil's Lake. John Alden, Oakland, Calif., broke the world record in B-stock hydro five-mile competitive racing with a time of 56.285 miles an hour. The old record for the event was 55.249. Leo Sutter, Seattle, established a new mark when he toured the B-U runabout in a time of 52.083 to surpass the old mark of 50.533. Mike Reich, Aberdeen, Wash., shattered the D-stock hydro world mark of 61.643 by completing the event in the time of 64.470. John Hall, Salem, Ore., became the fourth racer to shatter a world mark when he completed the D-U runabout in the time of 55.970 m.p.h. The old time was 55.487. Chuck Parson, Lodi, Calif., broke his own record in F-facing runabout straightway kilometer in the time of 73.350. His previous record was 71.244.

WU, Linfield Post 2nd Wins

United Press International. Defending champion Willamette and Linfield posted second consecutive victories in the Northwest conference Saturday. The Bearcats defeated Lewis and Clark, 40-19, and Linfield topped Whitman, 34-13. The win left the schools in a tie for first place. Halfback Stan Solomon ran for four touchdowns and gained 234 yards to pace Willamette to its triumph. Linfield used two first half touchdowns passes by quarterback Bill Parrish to go ahead 21-0 and was never headed. In non-conference games Pacific defeated Oregon College of Education, 20-14, and College of Idaho dropped a 21-7 decision to Hamilton Air Force Base.

Third Round TKO Stops Kenny Lane

Los Angeles — (UPI) — Sharp-punching Len Mathews of Philadelphia Saturday night scored a third-round knockout over Kenny Lane of Muskegon, Mich., cutting his opponent so badly that the nationally televised bout was stopped with only nine seconds left in the round. The 21-year-old Mathews, promised a shot at the world's welterweight crown, capitalized on Lane's tendency to cut from the second round until the bout was stopped by Referee Frankie Van.

ORDER RESCINDED

Portland — (UPI) — The Oregon state game commission has rescinded an order allowing a 30-trout per day bag limit on the middle fork of the Willamette river and tributaries above the mouth of Salt creek. State Game Director P. W. Schneider said the regular bag limit now applies to these waters. The liberal limit was placed in effect prior to chemical treatment of the waters. Some of the tributary waters were not touched and these will provide angling throughout the remainder of the season.

Illegal Tactic Charges Made By Waterfield

Chicago — (UPI) — Los Angeles Rams coach Bob Waterfield claimed today he knew the "Bear" facts why his team lost to pass-happy Chicago — and he planned to tell them to National Football league commissioner Pete Rozelle. Waterfield charged after the Rams' 34-27 loss to the Bears at Wrigley Field Sunday that Bear owner-coach George Halas deliberately disrupted the Rams' offensive signals, causing Los Angeles to commit backfield mistakes. The Ram mentor said Halas had instructed one of the Bear line-backers, Bill George, to imitate the offensive signals of Los Angeles quarterback Bill Wade, forcing the Rams into illegal procedure and off-side penalties. Los Angeles was called four times for the infractions in the first half, and once confusion in the backfield caused Wade to fumble. The fumble led to a first-period field goal for the Bears. Waterfield said Rozelle had ruled earlier on "copy-cat tactics" such as these and they were to be subject to a 15-yard penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct.

Brodie Sparks San Francisco

Detroit, Mich.—(UPI)—Quarterback John Brodie came to the aid of starter Y. A. Tittle in the final minutes at Detroit Sunday—and sparked the San Francisco Forty Niners to a 14-10 victory over the Lions. The former Stanford ace took over with seven minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, with San Francisco trailing 10-0. He passed to Billy Wilson to get the Forty Niners on the scoreboard with just three minutes remaining—and then hit R. C. Owens with the clincher in the final second of play. The Lions took the opening kickoff and marched 93 for their only touchdown of the day. The passing combination of quarterback Jim Ninowski and rookie end Gail Cogdill highlighted the drive, and Ken Webb carried the ball in from the one yard line.
