

Campaign Quotes

By United Press International Vice President Richard M. Nixon (to a San Diego rally):

"There must be no dollar sign on what we are willing to spend to keep America the strongest nation in the world. We must anticipate that our defense expenditures will go up rather than down in the period immediately ahead of us."

"These insurances of survival which I have enumerated will be expensive and we must be prepared, if necessary, to pay more taxes to meet the bill . . . Kennedy has openly and repeatedly called these islands (of Quemoy and Matsu) indefensible, even though the gallant Chinese Nationalist troops have successfully defended them now for 10 years. Furthermore, since the American resolve to defend them as part of the defense of Formosa has been made unmistakably clear, the Communists have not so far chosen to mount any measure of offensive against these islands."

"Now Sen. Kennedy talks of drawing new lines in the Formosa Straits, at what he calls a more defensible position, leaving Quemoy and Matsu to the mercy of the Chinese Communists."

"Of one thing he can be dead certain, they will take him at his word if the election should be favorable to his candidacy."

(In Albuquerque, N.M.): "The Senator apparently has concluded that giving up Quemoy and Matsu is the price of peace. I say it is an invitation to another Korea."

Sen. John F. Kennedy (to business publications conference in New York City): "One of the great political myths of our time is that there is an inevitable conflict be-

tween the business community and the Democratic party . . .

"My administration will not be a businessman's administration but neither will it be a labor administration, or a farmer's administration."

"It will be an administration representing, and seeking to serve all Americans . . .

"Big business is not an issue - not at a time when the party which last made it an issue has expanded the federal payroll to an all-time high, operated at an \$18 billion deficit, increased the debt limit five times, caused the highest peacetime deficit in our history and spent two-thirds as much money as all previous administrations put together . . .

"The performance of the Republican party has been inadequate in at least five areas of economic policy . . .

"I think we can do better . . . most businessmen share my concern . . .

"There is no place for the kind of political intervention which settled the steel strike . . . The president must actively use the powers of leadership in pursuit of well-defined goals of price stability . . .

"In this age when capitalism is on trial, we cannot have a policy that is less than the best. I am proud to be the candidate of the concerned, of the hopeful and of those who look for progress."

Suit Ridiculous, Sinatra Declares

Honolulu, Hawaii - (UPI) - Singer Frank Sinatra said Tuesday that a \$350,000 suit filed against him by a California couple is "utterly false and ridiculous."

Sinatra, here for the filming of "Devil at Four O'Clock" on the island of Maui, said he would prove his innocence when he returns to Los Angeles next week.

The crooner is being sued by Mr. and Mrs. James Kuykendal of Mar Vista on charges of assault, libel and slander. The suit filed in Los Angeles Superior Court Monday charged that Sinatra tried to run them down with his foreign-made sports car on Oct. 9, 1959, following a traffic accident.

The suit also charged that Sinatra followed and shouted obscenities at them.

Nixon's Daughters Give Away Kittens

Washington - (UPI) - Tricia and Julie Nixon, Vice President Richard M. Nixon's daughters, have finally given away the last of their six kittens.

The snow white, blue-eyed kitten was given Tuesday to Paula Suter, 6, of Baltimore, the United Cerebral Palsy Association's 1960 poster girl.

Mrs. Pat Nixon promised Paula nearly a year ago that she would give her a kitten as soon as the family cat had a litter.

The kitten was presented to its new mistress on the front steps of the Nixon house. Tricia, 14, and Julie, 11, posed on the steps with Paula while photographers took pictures.

Cuban Attache Barred by U. S.

Washington - (UPI) - The United States has barred Cuba's military attache from routine tours made by Latin American officers of military installations in this country.

Diplomatic sources said today the decision stemmed from a demand by Argentina that Cuba declare whether it has become a military ally of Russia.

Maj. Gen. Harvey H. Fischer outlined the new policy in issuing an invitation to his colleagues on the Inter-American Defense Board to visit installations in Texas and Oklahoma Oct. 25-29.

"In view of the anxiety expressed by the Inter-American Defense Board delegations in connection with the present intentions of the Cuban delegation and government," he said, "the U.S. delegation does not consider it appropriate to extend the invitation to the Cuban delegate."

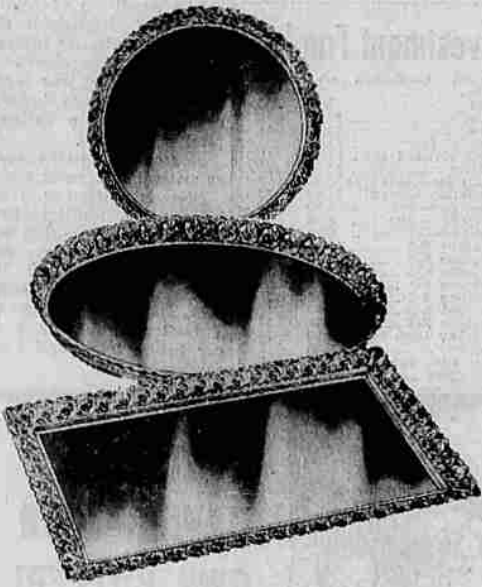

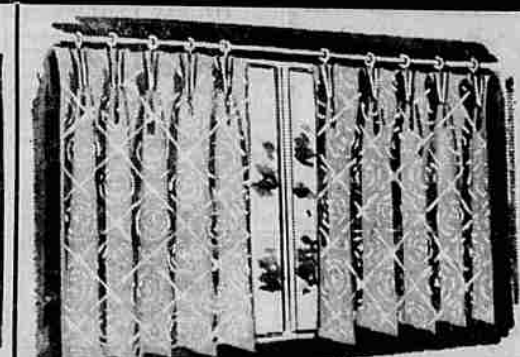
