Taylor Pacing Pro Statistics

New York — (UPI) — Fullback Jim Taylor of the Green Bay Packers, a big factor in the upset victory over the Baltimore Colts last Sunday, leads the National Football league in both ball carrying and scoring, according to the latest league statistics.

The 215-pound Louisiana State graduate has gained 281 yards in three games for a 4.9 average. Taylor tops the league in scoring with 30 points on five touchdowns.

The Cleveland Browns' one-two punch of Jimmy Brown and Bobby Mitchell are second and third in ball carrying. In two games, Brown has gained 240 yards and Mitchell 208.

Although he had a bad day against the Packers last Sunday, Johnny Unitas of the Colts replaced Bobby Layne of the Pittsburgh Steelers as the NFL's top passer.

Unitas has completed 47 passes out of 93 attempts, gained 785 yards, thrown six touchdowns passes, has a 50.5 completion percentage, a 5.4 interception percentage and an average gain of 8.12.

Next Step in Feud With Pauling Up To Subcommittee

Washington — (UPI) — The next move was up to the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee today in its running feud with Nobel Prize-winning chemist, Dr. Linus Pauling.

Twice Pauling has been summoned before the Senate group, and twice he has refused to tell who helped him collect signatures among scientists of 50 nations to a 1958 "peace petition" calling for a ban on all nuclear testing.

Sen. Thomas J. Dodd, (D-Conn.), acting chairman of the subcommittee, told reporters after public hearings Tuesday he was not sure whether Pauling would be cited for contempt of Congress.

That would be a matter for the full Senate Judiciary Committee to decide, Dodd explained, but he said he "assumed" the subject "might be raised" when the committee reviews the record we've made here.

The latest round in the feud was acted out Tuesday when the silver-haired scientist, after earlier telling a news conference he would ignore a Senate subpoena, changed his mind overnight and showed up for the hearing.

But Pauling again refused to divulge the names of his helpers, backing up a stand he took before the same subcommittee last June 21.

He contended innocent persons might be harmed by "reprisals from this subcommittee."

BARNES OPTIMISTIC
Los Angeles — (UPI) — UCLA Head Coach Bill Barnes is pessimistic about the Bruins' chances this Saturday in Seattle against the tough Washington Huskies. He is having his team drill all this week behind closed doors on the Westwood campus. The Bruins have been idle for three weeks. "What we needed even more than extra time," Barnes moaned, "was game experience. The Huskies have already played four games to our two." The Bruins held a dummy scrimmage Tuesday.

It took just a week for the champion Montreal Canadiens to do it, but they are back in first place following a 3-2 conquest over the New York Rangers at Madison Square Garden Tuesday night.

In the only other game played Tuesday, Alex Del Vecchio scored on a power play with less than six minutes remaining to give Detroit a 3-3 tie at Boston.

The Quebec Aces, taking advantage of all the breaks they can get, found themselves in the unaccustomed position of a first division berth in the American Hockey league today.

The Aces scored twice while Providence was short-handed to edge the Reds in overtime, 6-5, in the only game scheduled Tuesday night.

The senior Vandals then scrimmaged on their own. Idaho is still looking for its first win, but is not expected to find it against the rugged Beavers.

Los Angeles — (UPI) — Two fine rookie quarterbacks, Bill Nelson of the Southern California Trojans and Randy Gold of the California Golden Bears, will face each other here Saturday in the Coliseum in a rematch of last year's controversial battle between the

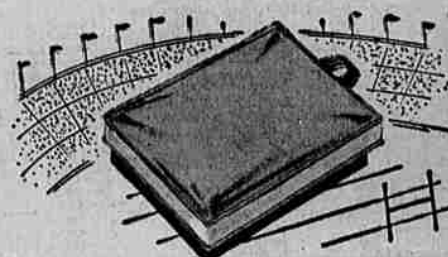

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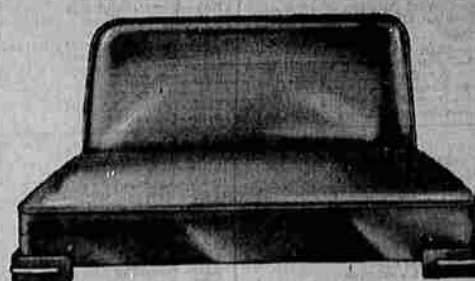
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
