New York—Premier Khrushchev, to newsmen after Wednesday night's U.N. General Assembly session was abruptly adjourned in near pandemonium:
"The interesting thing is that a gavel was broken at the moment the president adjourned the assembly. It is the beginning of the disintegration of the United Nations."
Pittsburgh—New York Yankee manager Casey Stengel, dodging questions on his choice of a pitcher for today's deciding game of the World Series:
"I'll let you know when I get to the ball park."
Washington—Adm. Arthur W. Radford, retired former chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, refuting Sen. John F. Kennedy's charge that Quemoy and Matsu islands could not be defended:
"There are few places in the world that are not defensible if you put enough into it."

Sen. John F. Kennedy (speech at New York on defense of Nationalist China-held islands of Matsu and Quemoy): Vice President Richard M. Nixon "invites war" by "trigger-happy leadership" on a commitment to defend the two offshore islands.
Kennedy pledged to "take whatever steps are necessary to defend American security and world freedom" but "not risk American lives and nuclear war" through "an unwise commitment."
"That is a foolhardy and reckless decision (to defend Matsu and Quemoy) against a possible attack by Communist China. If the (Nixon) followed through on it, it would mean a tragic disaster. If he backed down on it, it could mean retreat under Communist pressure."
"At a time when we have been steadily reducing our conventional forces and inviting a lag in missile power, I do not intend to let Nationalist Chinese president Chiang Kai-shek and the Chinese Communists decide whether our troops shall fight in those islands."
Vice President Richard M. Nixon (speech at rally outside Los Angeles replying to Kennedy's latest remarks on Matsu and Quemoy): Challenged Kennedy to "name one Republican president who led this country into war" during the last 50 years "and I can name three Democratic presidents who have done so."
"The argument of indefensibility will not stand up. The same standard could be applied to Berlin," which he said also should be defended.
Nixon (statement issued at Los Angeles):
—In regard to whether he would name a Negro to his cabinet: "I would seek the very best men possible without regard to race, creed or color."
—Federal school aid: "I have consistently taken the position that federal aid with school construction on a primary or secondary level should be allocated by the recipient states in accordance with state laws."
