Four Persons Are Injured in Crash On Table Rock Rd.

Four persons were injured yesterday morning in a collision between two pick-up trucks in the fog on Table Rock rd. about one-fourth mile south of the Antelope rd. intersection.

State police said the injured were Mrs. Catherine Elizabeth Walker, 56 of 902 1/2 North Central ave., driver of one vehicle Medford, her two children, Linda Lea Walker, 10, and Brenton Robert Walker, 9, both of route 2, box 320, Central Point, and Robert Eugene Klusman, 33, of 2985 Sunnyvale lane, Central Point, operator of the other vehicle.

The woman and her youngsters were taken by Medford ambulance to Rogue Valley hospital where attendants listed the boy in serious condition.

Condition of Mrs. Walker and her daughter was fair. Mrs. Walker has leg and chest injuries and facial lacerations, the hospital said. Her son has a possible head injury and the girl an injured knee. Police said both the boy and girl had severe cuts and bruises, and Klusman a bad cut on one leg.

State police reported that Mrs. Walker, who was southbound, told an officer she had been following a logging truck for some distance and decided to pass it. Her vehicle hit the northbound vehicle driven by Klusman on its left front fender, tipping it on its side. The Walker vehicle continued across the highway into a borrow pit on the east side and then into a field.

Mrs. Walker was advised by police that a complaint would be filed against her in district court for failure to drive on the right side of the highway.
