

Hartman Heads OCC In Passing

Portland — (UPI) — Bob Pennel of Oregon College of Education has taken over the rushing leadership among Oregon Collegiate Conference football players. The sophomore halfback has gained 263 yards in three games to 262 yards in four games for Al Barnes of Southern Oregon. In passing, Oregon Tech's Dick Olivas has jumped in front. Olivas has 22 completions in 55 attempts for 369 yards while Bob Grant of Portland State has 22 for 58 for 301 yards.

Howard Hartman of Southern Oregon has caught 12 passes for 183 yards. Pennel leads in scoring with 24 points.

BUCK FEVER

The rivers are brimful of fighting steelhead and again I find myself chasing deer beyond the time originally allotted. The chase has become one of vengeance, now that the discovery has been made that one can never be sure of an immunity to buck fever. To miss five shots at five bucks cannot be believed except by those who suffer the identical sickness. Now the hunt must continue in order to effect the cure. The fish will have to be caught next year.

MARKET HUNTER

Many of us would like to believe that the day of the market hunter is past, and with the bulk of present laws relating to the taking of fish and game, one would think it almost impossible. But there is a form of this type of hunting in existence right here in Southern Oregon, with practically no limit on the amount of game taken. And at the present time, there is very little that can be done about it.

TRIBAL RIGHTS

It seems that there are individuals who have married into the Klamath Indian tribe, and are making a business of selling venison. No one would object to their taking deer for their own use, even if they hunt and shoot deer all year. This is a tribal right reserved for members of the tribe so long as they do their hunting on the reservation. However, the individuals in question wait until deer season and then go over to the reservation, shoot as many as 25 deer,

transport them back to this area, and then sell them to persons either unable or without the time to shoot their own deer. The only illegal aspect to the whole business is in the buying and selling of the venison, but catching them at it is rather difficult. If there is an illegal way to make a dollar, there are always those who are willing to try it.

NO DOES AGAIN

It's simply amazing how the hunters are able to kill so many deer out of the non-existent mule deer herd in Eastern Oregon! Three years ago there were individuals ready to swear that the herd was already killed off by the opening of a season on deer, and yet last year gave witness to a record kill of deer in the state. This makes it a sad thing to find those who still are convinced that the herd is in danger.

FACT VS. FANCY

There seems to be a natural resistance on the part of some outdoorsmen in accepting the recommendations of biologists. Perhaps they feel that a scientific, factual study of deer and their habits is no more reasonable than their adamant belief in a buck-only season. They believe this even though there are states where both bucks and does have been hunted for over a hundred years, and the deer herds are vigorous and thriving despite the practice. Unreason will not admit to reason.

THE ANGLER'S LOG

The earlier reference to rivers brimful of steelhead was a true statement of the present situation. Reports from the Rogue locate the runs from Robertson bridge on down. The fish are averaging between three and six pounds and are believed to be the return run of the small half-pounders of last year. The catch last year, by the way, was around 25,000 steelhead.

Bertz Dies At Eugene

Eugene — (UPI) — George Bertz, 67, retired sports editor of the Portland, Ore., Journal, died early today, apparently from a heart attack.

Bertz was sports editor of

the daily newspaper for more than 37 years and was on its sports staff for 47 years prior to his retirement in 1958. He came here for a golf sweepstakes at the Eugene Country club and was stricken during the night at a motel. Bertz was noted for his record keeping ability. Once when the Pacific Coast baseball league checked its records and found them inadequate, league directors replaced their entire file by purchasing Bertz' own records kept since the league started.

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Albany Travels To Marshfield

United Press International Unbeaten Albany travels to Marshfield and North Salem is at home against Roseburg in two of the top Oregon high school football games tonight. Albany will take a 5-0 record into its game with the Pirates, who own a 3-1-1 mark, while North Salem will match a 3-1-1 record against Roseburg's 4-1 standing.

Defending state champion Medford, the top-rated team in Oregon, is scheduled to play Klamath Falls at Medford.

The state's second-ranked team, Jefferson, will be at home against Grant and will be attempting to gain its 33rd consecutive Portland Inter-scholastic League victory.

Other top games tonight include Madison-Franklin, Benson-Roosevelt, Reynolds-Park-rose, David Douglas-Gresham, Central Catholic-Sunset, Tigard - McMinnville, North Bend-North Eugene, South Eugene - Springfield, Ashland-Grants Pass, Yreka - Crater, Baker-Prineville, La Grande-The Dalles, Hermiston - Bend, Pendleton - Redmond, Sweet Home - Corvallis and South Salem-Lebanon.

Washington — (UPI) — The U.S. Public Health Service has approved a water pollution control grant to Seaside, Ore., of \$29,770.

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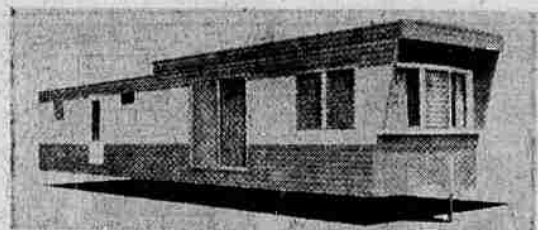
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
