Westminster Church To Hear Missionary

The Rev. Richard J. Cochran, who is now on home assignment after having served for 10 years in Mosul, Iraq, and two years in Beirut, Lebanon, will be guest speaker at the Westminster Presbyterian church Sunday morning.

During most of his years in Mosul, he was the only Christian missionary in the city of 180,000 people and established a church which continues its work there. In September, 1958, the Iraqi government asked many of the missionaries in the country to leave and Mr. and Mrs. Cochran went to Lebanon where he has done evangelistic work at the Hamlin hospital for chest diseases.

Mr. Cochran will speak at the 11 a.m. service on the subject "Answer for a Hajji." Otis Swisher will sing the solo "The Publican" and the Children's church will be held. There are two nurseries, one for babies and children through two years and the other for children from 3 to 4 years.
