German Hunt Is Meeting Subject

The Jackson County Toas-
t-masters club, which last week
heard a talk on hunting in
Germany, will meet at 6:30
a.m. Monday in the Jackson
hotel.
Hans Hess, Medford, for-
merly of Germany, said hunt-
ing in Germany is much dif-
ferent than hunting for deer
and ducks in this country.

In Germany only the privi-
leged few can afford to hunt,
and it is done on private lands
or restricted game reserves.
Since the lands are so restric-
ted almost all of the stocking
must be done by private in-
dividuals, Hess explained.
"The hunt is conducted by
the hunt-master," Hess said.
"He assembles all members at
a central starting point and
briefs each on proper proce-
dures to be used and the type
of game to be shot. Game
beaters help drive the game
toward the hunters."
Other Monday morning
speakers include Vince Arm-
strong, Medford, on "Stepping
Stones" and Tom Roberts,
Medford, on "Ride in a Jet."
The morning's topic session
was devoted to discussion of
parliamentary procedure.

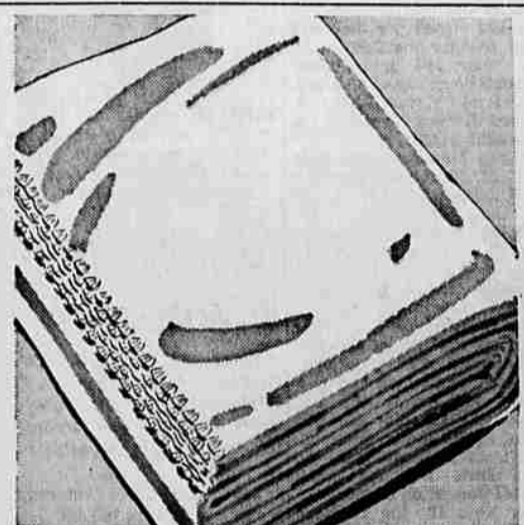

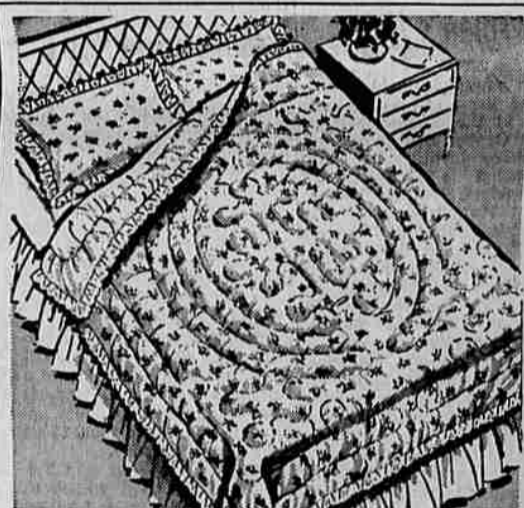
