

# Canada Fails to See Spark Igniting 'Soaring Sixties'

New York — UPI — Like the United States, our northern neighbor Canada has failed to see its economy touch off the spark that was to ignite the "soaring sixties."

Following a notably upswing in 1959, Canadian business slowed down to a walk in the first eight months of 1960.

With the growing impact of

ample world productive capacity and intensified competition, combined with the moderating influence of monetary restraint, North American demands for industrial materials and for new plant and equipment have not swelled in the way many people anticipated, according to the Bank of Nova Scotia.

Attention has been concentrated on the more economic handling of inventories rather than on building them up; capital investment programs have been maintained but not expanded; and commodity prices in general have been

under downward pressure rather than upward.

And along with these real developments, the bank pointed out, the talk of inevitable inflation, which was so prominently last year, has now greatly subsided.

**Slim Production Rise**

Canadian production in the first half of this year ran about 3 per cent ahead of the comparable 1959 period, but the bank said most of this advance had been achieved before the start of the year.

After allowing for seasonal variations, the volume of industrial output, at mid-year

was somewhat lower than at the turn of the year, it added.

The employment trend has managed to point upwards slightly, mainly because of the persistent increase in activity in many service industries.

The strongest expansive influence on the Canadian economy this year has been the upturn in European business which developed around the middle of 1959 and had risen to boom proportions in the early months of 1960.

The increase in European demands, together with a notable reduction in trade restrictions there and in sev-

eral Commonwealth countries, has enlarged the overseas flow of many Canadian goods, particularly manufactured items.

However, the bank noted, a decline in overseas purchases of wheat and other farm products has offset some of the gain in non-agricultural shipments.

**Decline in Exports**

And while exports to the United States were bolstered in late 1959 and 1960 by orders for steel and base metals, occasioned by the U.S. strikes in these industries, shipments since April have been reduced both by the leveling off in

U.S. economic activity and by the sharp curtailment in uranium shipments.

The bank said the recent developments in manufacturing scarcely signal any quick or marked renewal of Canadian business expansion the rest of the year. Nor do the similar conditions in the United States lend any distinct encouragement, it added.

It noted, however, that easier conditions in the capital market in Canada, together with the reenergizing of direct government mortgage lending should at least halt the decline in home building, and should also stimulate spending by provinces and municipalities.

In addition, the recent decision permitting an immediate start on the big project for exporting Alberta gas to California should strengthen business capital spending, while the somewhat lower exchange rate on the Canadian dollar should help to relieve the pressure of foreign competition, the bank stated.

**Small Worlds Around Us**

**That Strange Bird, the Grebe, Is More Fish than Fowl**

The diving bird called "grebe" really doesn't have horns—it just looks that way. Tufts of feathers resemble those of a satanic majesty, and being two colored, they are "pied." So we arrive easily at the name "pied-billed grebe."

All the grebes are queer. To watch the so-called "heli-diver" for only a few minutes is to acquire a new respect for the swimming and diving abilities of this aquatic bird.

The grebe is actually more fish than fowl, as it spends its entire life in the water. Even the nest is a floating structure of rotting vegetation, prevented from drifting away by being tied to the water plants among which it is always placed.

**Adapted For Water Life**

Its legs are especially designed for life in the water by being placed far back on the body. About all the bird could do on land would be to slide along on its stomach, like a man pushing a wheelbarrow without the wheel.

Usually, the only way to find the grebe's nest is to actually see it leave the nest, mark its location carefully, and go directly to it. As soon as the female grebe leaves her nest she piles plants and nesting material on the eggs or young.

When it is carefully hidden, she dives underwater, swims some distance and comes to the surface. Her ability to remain underwater is only duplicated by the cormorant.

Perhaps some of this bird's other names were given it by people who were impressed by its underwater performance, for in some sections it is called "water-witch" and "dipper."

The pied-billed grebe is not a handsome bird. The upper parts are a brownish-black, shading into a lighter brown on the stomach. The bill is short and thick. The principal food consists of water insects, leeches and an occasional frog or small fish. The grebes are related to the loons.

Scientists place these birds close to the reptiles. The motions of the neck are even snake-like, and the method of trying to walk on land is more of a crawl than a walk.

**Fast Moving**

Small boys with rifles waste plenty of ammunition trying to hit these fast moving birds; the bird's quickness in diving beneath the water makes it a difficult target.

It is a strange bird and there are many pages of its life history that have never been written.

To hear the uncanny series of peculiar and unearthly cries uttered by the grebe makes the listener realize and wonder if there really is justification for the name "heli-diver" for the bird actually does seem to have the phenomenal ability to dive into the terrible depths of the unknown region below.
