

# New Jersey Votes in Presidential Race Could Tip to Either Candidate

Trenton, N. J. — (UPI) — New Jersey heads into the Nov. 8 election with a see-saw balance of national and local candidates which could tip either way.

Vice President Richard M. Nixon and Sen. John F. Kennedy and the two vice presidential contenders have campaigned in the state several times. Both camps plan to return Nixon and Kennedy to the state shortly before election day. They're campaigning for the 16 electoral votes of a state which ranks 46th in size in the nation.

To understand their feelings, it is necessary to study the intangibles which exist here.

Crowded into 7,836 square miles are more than 6 million persons who make up the largest population density per square mile in the nation.

The residents are generally politically sophisticated in a state which has long had party bosses and people who relied on them for jobs.

There is a heavy Catholic population in New Jersey and a large percentage of Catholic-Protestant - Jewish intermarriage which could make them

quite tolerant of the religious question.

It is also a prime commuter state with a high percentage of upper income suburbanites living here and working in New York or Philadelphia. It is also a major industrial state.

Democrats are out to upset the landslide victory secured by President Eisenhower in 1952 and 1956.

The traditional Republican state elected Gov. Robert B. Meyner in 1954 and 1958 and there appears to be little question that Meyner wields a strong hand in control of the Democratic state party.

He is doing all he can to insure Kennedy's victory in the state, partly in compensation for refusing to hand over his favorite-son votes to Kennedy on the first ballot at the national convention and partly because Meyner will be unemployed in 1962. The two-term governor cannot run for reelection.

On the two major swings Kennedy and Nixon made in northern New Jersey, most observers felt that both candidates were well received.

GOP state Chairman Charles R. Erdman Jr. says "Nixon intends to campaign as vigorously in the Democratic counties as he will in Bergen or any other Republican county."

Meyner also is conceding no points to either side, but

he has said, "I feel the presidential races — both nationally and on the state level — will be very close. We must take nothing for granted in our campaign efforts."

## Weather Conditions Not Duplicated

Louisville, Ky. — (Science Service) — Each continent has its own special weather conditions that are nowhere duplicated, Dr. Erwin R. Biel, professor of meteorology at Rutgers University, New Brunswick, N. J., predicted here.

He said a better understanding of these conditions should lead to a better life for man. Dr. Biel told the University of Louisville chapter of Sigma Xi, national organization for the encouragement of scientific research, that the shape of continents, the placement of mountain ranges and the large-scale flow pattern of air resulting from these factors influence the occurrence, intensity and paths of storms.
