The 26-year-old actress spent 10 days in St. Tropez, part of the time in a clinic, and two days at her luxury cottage near Paris. She slashed her wrists and took an overdose of sleeping pills because of what doctors called a period of deep depression.

Candidates Review Proposed Changes in Governing Ashland

Ashland—Proposed city government changes and a review of current policies were presented to the Ashland Chamber of Commerce by seven candidates for city offices at the chamber's weekly noon luncheon Tuesday at the Mark Antony hotel.

Four mayor and three city council candidates discussed possible changes and the current conditions of the city government.

W. R. Brown, candidate for mayor, advocated a city manager form of government for Ashland. He also proposed that city employees be classified under civil service. In addition, Brown suggested that city employees should live within the city limits.

Russell Osborn, mayor candidate, also advocated city manager government. Osborn also proposed open hearings for establishing public utility rates. In addition, Osborn said that a reserve city police force should be formed.

Glenn Revel, candidate for mayor, stated that he was opposed to city manager government for Ashland. Revel said he favored city inspection of buildings and elimination of billboards in the city.

R. L. Neill, Ashland mayor, reviewed programs initiated during his seven years in office. He cited the new hospital, improved city streets, and newly-remodeled city hall as projects carried out during his terms.

George Jones, city council candidate, called for more economy in the city government.

Council Candidate Duane Baker said the council should re-evaluate current policies regarding subdivisions in the city. "Currently the tax payers are paying for privately

IUE Authorized To Settle Strike

New York—UPI—International Union of Electrical Workers negotiators meet General Electric officials today with blank check authority to settle the 18-day strike on whatever terms they see fit.

But General Electric indicated it would not alter the contract proposals it made Aug. 30, which the IUE has rejected.

The Union's GE conference board, faced with a defection by its largest local and back-to-work sentiment elsewhere, Tuesday approved union president James B. Carey's proposal that the negotiating committee be given full authority to sign a new pact without prior approval by the conference board.

The blank check, however, is good only until Sunday. If no agreement has been reached by then, the conference board will hold another meeting a week from today.

The IUE has demanded a two-year contract with 3 1/2 per cent wage increases each year. GE's Aug. 30 offer was a three-year contract with wage hikes of 3 per cent immediately and 4 per cent in April, 1962.
