President Found To Be in Tip-Top Physical Condition

Washington (Science Service) — President Eisenhower celebrated his 70th birthday in tip-top physical condition, "feeling very well, indeed," despite the series of major illnesses he has suffered in the past eight years.

The Commander-in-Chief got a clean bill of health, medically verifying his own cheerful diagnosis, following a recent check-up at Walter Reed hospital. This was part of his regular yearly physical check-up, an examination required annually of every Army officer.

Physicals for enlisted men are set by Army regulations at three-year intervals. The medical examination given the nation's first soldier was essentially that given any soldier in an Army hospital, regardless of rank.

Neither the overnight stay in the hospital last month nor the longer hospitalization President Eisenhower has experienced for some of his check-ups are exceptional, Dr. Conn L. Milburn, Army colonel and executive officer at Walter Reed hospital, told Science Service.

Hospitalization for a check-up is prompted primarily by convenience. Most patients can be just as thoroughly examined in a doctor's office, Dr. Milburn said.

"But hospitalization expedites the examination. In a hospital, all the facilities routinely required for a thorough diagnostic examination are close at hand, such as those needed for x-ray, electrocardiogram, blood tests, or basal metabolism tests. This cuts down the time for the examination and makes the results more quickly available," Dr. Milburn explained. "It also saves a lot of wear and tear on both the patient and the doctor."

Special Observation
If the patient has a past history of gastrointestinal illness, then a thorough examination is preferable in a hospital because certain tests might require either special observation or special preparation of the patient. For example, an accurate measure of gastric juices at specified intervals might be part of a check-up examination.

A recovered cardiac patient, a patient who had suffered a stroke, a recovered tubercular patient, or one who had recovered from cancer—all these would be better and more easily examined in a hospital than in a doctor's office, Dr. Milburn said.

Dr. Milburn said it should be emphasized, however, that the failure of a doctor to hospitalize a patient for an annual examination in no way indicates lack of thoroughness, even if the patient had recovered from one of the aforementioned serious illnesses, provided all the necessary tests were conducted. He pointed out that, in fact, most annual check-ups are done in a doctor's office and done very thoroughly.

Check-up Mandatory
President Eisenhower suffered a serious heart attack in 1955, followed by an operation for ileitis, an ailment involving the small intestine. Little more than a year later, he suffered from a stroke. This past history, under the preventive philosophy guiding medicine today, would make an annual check-up mandatory, even if the patient involved were not the nation's leader.

In fact, Dr. Milburn advised both men and women after
