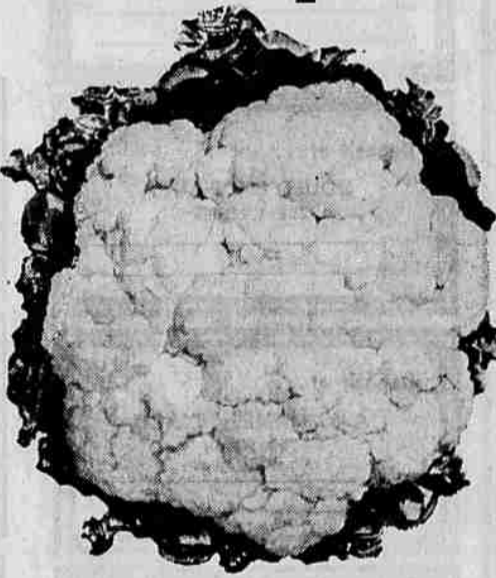

Oxidation Lagoon For Sewage To Get Additional Study

Corvallis - Disposal of sewage and industrial wastes in oxidation lagoons appears feasible for western Oregon, research by Oregon State college indicates, but another year of work is planned before final recommendations can be made.

The low-cost lagoons are used widely in the midwest and southwest but their use in high rainfall regions has been limited by lack of research. The OSC experiment, started in 1958 with the cooperation of Corvallis city and the State Sanitary Authority, was the first to be tried in this type of climate.

The experimental lagoon is 2.3 acres in size with varying depths up to three feet. It is constructed adjacent to the Corvallis sewage treatment plant.

Inexpensive to build and operate, the lagoons have found favor with small communities and industries which are unable to afford sewage treatment plants. OSC engineers pointed out. However, larger communities are using them also where sufficient land is available.

Reduction in Cost
Reduction in sewage disposal costs of from \$10 to \$20 per capita have been reported.

In charge of the OSC study are Fred J. Burgess and Martin Northcraft of the civil engineering department. They have received a new grant of \$8,800 from the National Institutes of Health to carry research on through 1961.

During the coming year, emphasis will be on determining the waste load capacity of the lagoon; operational problems and possibilities with various types of sewage and industrial wastes; best ways to achieve mosquito control; and growth of algae that is an essential part of the oxidation process. Odors are not a problem unless the lagoon becomes overloaded.

Alarm Repeater Warns Families Of Attack Alert

Miami Beach - UPI - A sleepless air raid alarm to be plugged into a wall socket and set off by authorities to alert every family which has one has been described to the American Legion.

The alarm, to cost about \$10, could also be used to warn of approaching hurricanes and tornadoes. It will be available in about a year, said Leon A. Hoegh, director of the office of Civil Defense and Defense Mobilization.

The alarm is named "NEAR," which stands for National Emergency Alarm Repeater. The system is nearing the end of development by a number of private contractors, Hoegh said.

10-Second Surge
He said a family can buy the device, twice the size of a king size cigarette pack, and plug it into any electric outlet. A signal generator at the electric power plant would set off the alarms in each city with a 10-second surge of accelerated electric power. The power plant would get the order to sound the alarm from Civil Defense.

NEAR makes a penetrating sound, similar to an electric alarm clock for 50 seconds, is silent for 10 seconds and sounds again for 50 seconds.

Hoegh said Civil Defense would get the alert of an attack within 15 seconds from the military forces. The alarm could be set off in homes across the country within one minute.

Halloween Safeguards Noted by Specialist

Corvallis - Parents can safeguard small goblins, gremlins and ghosts this Halloween with some beforehand coaching, according to Jessalee Mallalieu, Oregon State college extension recreation specialist.

Her suggestions include: If youngsters are out at night in costumes, see that they wear some luminous or reflecting decorations on the costumes. Light-colored ones show up brighter in headlights of oncoming traffic.

Warn children about dashing out from between parked cars.

Check that costumes are not too long or tight for easy walking. Red sheets worn by ghosts have caused bad falls.

Before buying masks, be sure eye holes permit wearer to see clearly both straight and to each side.

A small flashlight is safer illumination for the jack-o-lantern than a candle.
