Removal of Cataract When Vision is Good in Unaffected Eye. For years I have been receiving letters from people who were very unhappy because an ophthalmologist had removed a cataract from one eye when they had perfectly good vision in the other eye. They were distressed when they found that they could not read as well as they did before the operation, unless, perhaps, they put a patch over the eye that had been operated on. When they tried putting a big thick lens over the eye that couldn't use their two eyes together because the images received from the two eyes were then so different in size that the brain could not fuse them.

Information Much Needed. Actually, today the giving of information is much needed in all types of medical practice, as I could easily demonstrate by showing a hundred letters from my correspondents. We doctors so commonly do things to people without explaining why we did them; and as a result, some of the patients are puzzled and some are made angry. After receiving scores of letters from patients who were dissatisfied after an operation on one cataract, and after talking to my many friends among the ophthalmologists, my impression is that if I had one cataract and one perfectly good eye I would not be operated on unless an able ophthalmologist told me he thought the cataract was getting so overly ripe that it might soon do harm to the rest of my eye.
