Top Reno Tailback Returns For Action In Medford Fracas

Reno, Nev.—(Special to the Mail Tribune)—Reno High School's Huskies, with their number one tailback returned to action but with three other key men on the banged-up list now, left here this morning for Medford, Ore., and probably their toughest game of the 1960 football season.

Cochair Bob Benson will run his single-wing offense against the Black Tornados of Medford high, defending Oregon grid champions, tonight.

The Red and Blue from Reno will enter tonight's action with a record of two wins and three losses. Victories have come over El Dorado of Placerville, Calif., 31-12, and Shasta of Redding, Calif., 21-6.

Three Toughies Left
Losses were to Nevada Union of Grass Valley-Nevada City, Calif., 13-6 in the season opener; to Chico, Calif., 13-6; and last week end to tough Las Vegas from southern Nevada, 34-7, in a class "AAA" encounter.

The Huskies have three left, all of them toughies. After Medford will come Rancho of Las Vegas in another "AAA" conference affair at Las Vegas. The finale will be with traditional rival Sparks, three miles from Reno. That one will be played in Reno on Veterans Day, Nov. 11. Sparks' lone loss in five games was by one point, 14-13, to the 6-0 Carson City Senators of Northern "AA" conference.

However, Reno's problem is two weeks closer. Benson indicated Wednesday night he will have number one tailback Dave Ricks ready to go at full strength for the first time since he suffered a shoulder separation in the season opener. And Ray Handley, a 6-0, 165-pound junior, who looked like a sure winner while Ricks was benched, is at top strength and ready in reserve.

McDonald Hurt
But the Red and Blue probably will be without its regular blocking back, sturdy Steve MacDonald, and without wingback Mike Lane. The latter has been out two weeks now and MacDonald turned in this week with a shoulder injury.

A third man on the "walking wounded" list is reserve tackle Doug Robb, who is hampered by torn ligaments in a knee and probably will miss the next two games.

Benson and Assistant Coach Bill Howton, a Reno high graduate, will accompany a squad of 27 players on the Oregon trip. The head man is a graduate of University of Wyoming, and follows the style he learned while playing for the Cowboys. Bud L. Beasley, chairman of the athletic committee at Reno high, will head the traveling group.

Pointers Beat Hedrick Eighth

Central Point—Central Point topped Hedrick of Medford here last night 13 to 0 in an eighth grade football game.

Mike Cassill ran 12 yards for a Pointer TD in the second quarter after an 56-yard romp by Dennis Faulkner. Cassill ran the bonus. A pass for two yards, Norman Henney to Frank Armstrong, got the other score.

The scrap, otherwise was a defensive battle. Hedrick blocked two Central Point punts. Steve Jorde of CP and John Pierce of Hedrick were defensive standouts and Jim Pitts shone for the Pointers with his blocking.
