

Sign Agreement Approved by Council

The Medford city council last night approved an agreement permitting billboards on city property near the airport, providing that the billboard company give the city a free sign and pay back rent.

The agreement does not permit the erection of any additional billboards. Under the agreement as originally proposed to the council, Foster and Kleiser company would simply turn one of its signs over to the city and then furnish advertising and maintenance of the sign in return for rent both past and future.

Directors To Be Nominated

Medford Chamber of Commerce President Gerald T. Latham appointed four men Thursday to serve on the chamber's nominating committee. The committee will nominate persons to sit on the chamber's board of directors.

Amendment Suggested. Councilman R. L. Van Sickle moved to amend the agreement by stipulating that the company pay the city \$345 in back rent accumulated over the past couple of years at the rate of \$25 annual rent per sign.

Council Asked To Summon Cab Firm To Answer Charge

Medford Lawyer Ben Day asked the Medford city council last night to summon Carl Kellenberger, owner of the Yellow Cab company, before it to show cause why his licenses to operate both a taxi cab company and limousine service should not be revoked.

Day, representing the Medford Airport Limousine service, said he was making the request on the grounds that Kellenberger has violated several provisions of the city code relating to the operation of both taxis and limousines.

Agreement Approved for Radio Transmitter on Roxy Ann Butte

Under the agreement the county would not be able to construct any facilities on the site without the prior approval of the city manager.

Two funds, the Stevens Street Water Main Fund No. 2, and the Washab Avenue Water Main Fund No. 1, were created by council action.

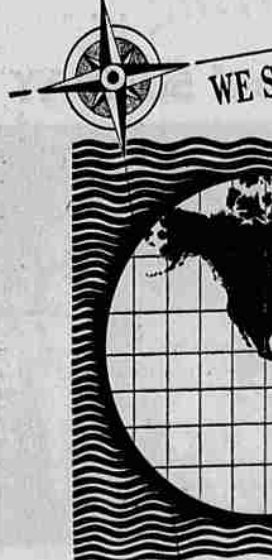
EX-OFFICER DIES
