THE FAMILY COUNCIL
Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, three editors and a women's editor. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counsellors.
Elsa B. - I love to be alone.
Larry B. - Then why did she get married?
Elsa B. - Whether you're married or not, isn't everyone entitled to some quiet time alone? My husband is like a little boy. He would like me at his side 24 hours a day.
I was an only child and always had a room of my own. I learned to enjoy quiet and solitude, and even now I like to close my eyes and think about the meaning of things without interruption. But too much quiet seems to annoy my husband. With calendars and clocks all around, he'll ask me what day it is or the time, just to break the silence.
I know marriage means sharing and I enjoy sharing my time with Larry. But he wants all of it. Can't he develop a few interests of his own and not depend upon me as a sort of full-time babysitter?
Larry B. - What did Elsa expect - an engagement ring, a wedding, a honeymoon, a new home, and then back to life as usual?
Marriage means two people become one. You don't go your separate ways any more. But with Elsa, having me around seems to annoy her. She says she loves me, but if you love someone you can't get enough of him, can you? Yet every time she talks to me she acts as if she's doing me a big favor.
Walk in the park, go to the movies - everywhere you see people in couples. But she tells me to go alone. Once in a great while she gives me a big break and we play cards together or go for a drive. Is she acting like a wife or a prima donna?
The Council: There seems to be a fear here, on each side, causing the extreme demands each is making. Elsa is afraid of losing her precious "island" of privacy completely. Larry worries lest the one thing he counted on marriage to give him - a steady pal - is slipping away.
This fear makes the demands almost hysterical. And naturally, the reaction of each party is also extreme and childlike.
It's true, Larry, that marriage makes two people one, but one what? One couple, with one set of goals. One of the goals is to make the other party happy, fulfilled, more effective than he or she could possibly have been alone. Elsa is still a separate person, as well as a mate, and Larry must show some deference and restraint toward that part of her. Instead he has been

stay close to him in the early years of their marriage, as he gains in social poise and confidence. This may be the small sacrifice she must make, for a while, in return for the added richness marriage has brought to her life.
Chances are that Larry, as part of the mutual determination to fill in the gaps for each other, will voluntarily offer Elsa large jobs of time for herself, knowing that this need on her part is entirely consistent with her need for his company, too.
And Elsa may choose to accompany her husband to meetings, classes or hobby clubs, once she sees how ungrudgingly he goes alone. It'll be more fun to be together when, for her at least, it's optional.
When two people marry, they still remain two people, but love makes them two less selfish people.
