By United Press International Vice President Richard M. Nixon:

(Speech to national Association of Business Economists at New York City): "America cannot view the future by using a rear view mirror. We must practice rigorous economy, exercise strict control over the federal budget, and thwart attempts, clearly fore-shadowed in opposition (Democrat) discussion, to undermine the independence of the Federal Reserve System."

Offering a 12-point economic program, which called for creation of a National Economic Council to coordinate government efforts to increase the rate of economic growth: "It repudiates the notion that we can meet the economic problems of the 1960s with retreats of depression-born ideas of the 1930's."

To guard against inflation: "Establish an early warning economy intelligence system" that would protect the economy through "flexible use of fiscal and credit policies, including tax adjustments if necessary."

Human Rights Council To Meet

Ashland - A panel discussion on "hate" literature will be presented Monday, Oct. 4, at 8 p.m. by Ashland Human Rights Council in Wesley house on the Southern Oregon college campus.

Speakers will discuss various aspects of the type of pamphlets, generally received in the mail, which attack certain racial or religious groups and which receive a particularly wide circulation during campaign years such as this one.

Walter Arron, associate professor of English of SOC, will analyze the content of the literature and the use of weighted words and colored phrases calculated to influence. Jack Kelly, associate professor of psychology, will deal with the psychological appeal to our baser natures and weaknesses. The Rev. Edward Waulfekueher of the Congregational church will approach the subject from the ethical viewpoint.

After the presentation there will be a short discussion period followed by a social hour. The public is invited, and a special invitation is extended to members of the Medford Human Rights Council.

Demos Choose Cook To Replace Wallace

Portland—(UPI)—Rep. Vernon Cook, Gresham, was chosen by the Multnomah County Democratic Central committee early Saturday for the state senate nomination vacated at the death of Lew Wallace of Portland.

Cook received 189 votes of the 367 votes cast on the second ballot. The meeting ended at 12:20 a.m.

Bill Toomey, head of the Wallace committee before his death, said the committee would endorse a Republican if Cook were elected.

Porter Writes Book About Latin America

Washington (Special) - Another Oregon public official has become an author on the side.

Rep. Charles O. Porter is a co-author of a new book called "The Struggle for Democracy in Latin America," according to the Macmillan Co., New York publishing house.

The late Sen. Richard L. Neuberger wrote several books, but none after he became a U.S. Senator. They were compiled during his service as a state legislator or before he entered public life and worked as a free lance writer.

Gov. Mark Hatfield has accepted an invitation from a publisher to do a political book, but there has been no word on when it might be published.

Works With Professor

Porter's book was done in collaboration with a Rutgers university professor who has written three previous books, including one entitled "Communism in Latin America." He is Robert J. Alexander.

The Porter-Alexander book is to be published in January. Alexander has made annual trips to various Latin countries since 1948. He has worked for the Office of Inter-American Affairs and the International Cooperation Administration where he specialized in Latin American affairs. He has also served as technical adviser to the AFL-CIO on labor problems in Latin America.

"The authors feel that United States policy toward Latin America has been questionable and clumsy," the publishing company stated. "They reinforce their comments with documentation.

They conclude with a suggested program which both men believe would better serve the mutual interests of the United States and Latin America."

Goes Into Background

Alexander explained, in a telephone interview from Rutgers, that the book goes into the background of economic, political and social developments of recent years, and that it relates the story of the fall of the dictators of such countries as Argentina, Colombia, Peru and Cuba.

In this connection, he said, the book relates the circumstances of the fall of Batista in Cuba and shows the opportunities which were presented to Castro when he came to power.

The authors lament Castro's failure to institute democratic reforms, Alexander said.

Remaining Dictators

The book also goes into the remaining dictatorships south of the border. Alexander said they list both Haiti and the Dominican Republic in this category, as well as Nicaragua.

Porter got interested in Latin American affairs upon his arrival in Washington following his election to Congress in 1956 when a Eugene boy, Gerald Lester Murphy, disappeared in the Dominican Republic. Urging prompt investigation by the State Department, the Murphy case became a sensation which apparently was linked to the earlier disappearance in New York of Columbia university Prof. Jesus de Galindez.

Porter has been on several trips to various Latin American countries since then, visiting Venezuela, Colombia, Mexico, Cuba, Panama and Costa Rica.
