Oregon State College Officials Visit BLM's Applegate District

Medford district of the bureau of land management entertained guests from Oregon State college on a field trip recently. The host for the field trip was Unit Forester Ernest Black of the Applegate forest management area. He was assisted by his timber management forester, Bill McLaughlin. The purpose of the trip was to show Oregon State college officials proposed timber harvest development plans and road construction work in the Williams creek, Munger creek and Deer creek drainages of the Applegate forest management area. John O'Leary, professor in logging engineering, and Assistant Professor John Bell of the OSC school of forestry, logging engineering department, visited the Williams area specifically to review existing road construction, and harvest plan presently proposed for developing timber in the Munger creek drainage.

O'Leary brought with him two foreign foresters who are connected with the ICA (International Cooperative Authority). They were Mr. Erfan from Iran and Mr. Wachter from Germany. O'Leary was accompanied by three of his own graduate forestry students. One of the graduate students has taken on as a project for his masters degree the problem of preparing a timber harvest development plan for this Munger creek area. The Munger creek area, particularly along the ridge leading up to main Munger butte, has some peculiar logging problems. Because of these problems the graduate student, Bill Ayars, will take into consideration an analysis of the best and most efficient method of logging the tract. This analysis may include the logging of the tract by a skagit over-head cable system or perhaps even with helicopter. The analysis will illustrate the different costs involved in the several systems of logging versus the constructing of a road which is the normal means of developing timber tracts for harvest in the Medford BLM area. Ayars contemplates the spending of his Christmas and Thanksgiving vacations gathering the field data on this project. The fact that there are numerous sparse tracts of timber, many of which are isolated, produces many peculiar and unusual problems in logging in the Medford area. Normally, logging roads are constructed to make these sparse and isolated tracts accessible. But roads are expensive, thus other means of transporting the logs to a common point are being considered.
