Vice President Richard M. Nixon:

(Speech at Toledo, Ohio): "There comes a time in each campaign when a candidate knows that the tide has turned and he is moving up to victory. That time in this campaign came when I entered Ohio..."

Americans "have finally caught up with the campaign of our opponents and they don't like it. The American people, whether they are Democrats or Republicans, are getting tired of being told they are a second rate bunch of people and a second rate country. Yes, of course, we have some problems. America must move forward... We will keep the country moving forward..."

(Speeches at Middletown and Dayton, Ohio): "Let's suppose you have a team and you're up against a tough opponent and then one who is a member of the team and who wants to be captain goes out and tells the other side 'Look, our team is no good, and you're going to lick us. Do you think that guy ought to be captain? I say no...'"

(Speech at Toledo): "If an agreement is not signed within a reasonable period after Feb. 1, the United States will have no alternative but to resume underground testing of atomic weapons. There is no question of returning tests in the atmosphere where some still undetermined danger of contamination exists..."

Sen. John F. Kennedy: (Speech at Mt. Clemens, Mich.): "I call upon Mr. Nixon to make public the secret government report on U.S. prestige - and to explain to the people how in the face of its evidence he can continue to pretend that our prestige is at an all-time high - and to explain why a public report... was not made public until its concealment was exposed. Perhaps this incident of political cover-up will remind us that it is time to face, not hide, the facts about our situation, both at home and abroad..."

(Speech at Detroit): Nixon "tells us repeatedly that in 1960 all is well - that our prestige is at an all-time high - that our prosperity is unprecedented - that we are ahead militarily, scientifically and educationally. Perhaps that fulfills his obligation in this election, but I say we also have an obligation to the next generation, and we are not meeting that obligation today. We cannot meet that obligation unless we think now in terms of 1970... The next 10 years, in short, will be a decade of opportunity. But they will also be a decade of challenge and effort. We are not meeting that responsibility when our economy is slipping into its third recession in six years. We are not meeting the needs of the future when 20 per cent of our industrial capacity is idle - when over five per cent of the labor force is unemployed... Mr. Nixon does not mention these present facts. Neither does he mention our future responsibilities. For his is the party of the past, the party of memory, the party of the status quo..."

Cuban Militia Sent To Barracks

restricted to barracks under army orders here today apparently to lend support to the revolutionary government's charge that Cuba is about to be invaded by refugees trained in Guatemala.

Premier Fidel Castro's "people's militia," made up largely of armed unionists, has been reporting to various barracks all week instead of drilling in the streets as usual. Rumors circulating in the streets said the "invasion fleet" has already sailed from Guatemala and that an attack may be expected no later than Saturday.

There has been speculation that the government plans to stage a phony invasion, perhaps coupled with false reports of Castro's death, in hopes of smothering out a growing anti-government underground.
