## Nixon Critical of Kennedy's Wealth; Tells Test Ban Plan

Abroad Nixon Train In Michigan—Vice President Richard M. Nixon became increasingly critical of Sen. John F. Kennedy's background of family wealth today as the Republican candidate whistled across Michigan where unemployment and the cost of living are vital election factors.

Opening his first day in Michigan at Monroe, the state's only port on Lake Erie and a town of about 25,000 population, Nixon attacked the federal spending policies of his Democratic opponent. He predicted a Kennedy victory with its resultant fiscal policies would result in generally higher prices across the country and a heavy federal deficit.

## Kennedy Speaks To Garment Workers In New York Rally

New York—(UPI)—Sen. John F. Kennedy, speaking to the biggest rally of his 1960 campaign, called on New York garment workers today to join him in "sweeping the Republicans all the way back to California."

The Democratic presidential nominee got his second tumultuous motorcade welcome in Manhattan from a crowd estimated at between 200,000 and 250,000 between 34th st. and 42nd st. along 7th ave.

Clouds of confetti, ticker-tape and odd lots of paper soared down on the senator and his party as they arrived for his first big rally sponsored by the International Ladies Garment Workers Union and presided over by its president, David Dubinsky.

Chants of "We want Kennedy" interrupted Dubinsky several times but the crowd quieted down for Sen. Herbert H. Lehman, who also joined in the introduction. The platform behind the presidential candidate held a lineup of motion picture and theatre figures including Melvyn Douglas, Henry Fonda, Tallulah Bankhead, Shelley Winters, and Janet Leigh.
