Editor's Note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, three editors and a women's editor. Each article is a summary of an actual case history. The Council reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

**Violet M.**—I don't want my mother to visit my school. Mrs. W. M.—She wants me to look like Rosalind Russell.

**Violet M.**—I'm 14 years old and a sophomore in high school. We're having Open School Week next week and I'm in mortal dread my mother will come. If she does, I'll never live it down.

Don't get me wrong. I know my mother is a wonderful woman. She's kind and good. And she's nice to talk to. But

when you see her you'll know what I mean. She just doesn't give a hang how she looks. I've seen some of the other mothers, especially those of my best friends. They're slim and they wear girdles. They keep their nails polished, use pancake makeup and eye shadow and really look smart.

My mother always looks as though she just finished scrubbing the floor, which she doesn't even do. We have a maid.

Mrs. W. M.—I believe in being myself and people can take me or leave me. My husband likes the way I look and so do my friends. I'm a part-time bookkeeper in an insurance office and no one there has ever objected to my appearance. My clothes are clean and they suit the occasion and the weather.

I'm not interested in following all the whims of fashion. When I read a paper or a magazine I skip the stuff about the new shodders and the old hems. I save my eleventh for the more important news like the new books, new inventions, new ideas about health and peace.

Right now Violet seems all mixed up about what really matters. I try to show her that it's the inside of people not the outside that she should pay attention to.

Of course I'm going to her school. I'm sorry if it embarrasses her. I am hurt and disappointed by her attitude.

The Council in her personal battle against regimentation, this mother seems unaware of her adolescent daughter's agonizing need for conforming. Or if she is aware, she doesn't see why she, as Violet's mother, must "match" the other members.

Of course she needn't goose-step. But there's no point in going to the other extreme of proclaiming her individuality via unkempt hair, sweaty, oily face, shapeless clothes, and what Mrs. M.'s best friends may not have told her—body odor. There are so many other ways of being "different"—commendable and admirable ways—that Mrs. M. would be wise, and a better mother of a teen-age daughter, to capitulate a bit in the matter of appearance.

Even then, Violet may be critical or, in Mrs. M.'s opinion, hypocritical. But realizing the period of life Violet is passing through should prevent Mrs. M. from feeling

Staunton, Va. — (UPI) — Back stairs at the traveling White House:

Admirers of President Eisenhower cannot resist showering him with gifts whenever he hits the road.

No one who travels with the Chief Executive would be surprised if his visit to Woodrow Wilson's birthplace here would involve presentation of a Virginia ham.

On his recent nine-day cross-country tour the President acquired the following gifts:

A miniature replica of the "Spirit of Detroit" statue, Mexican Indian blankets, life membership in the Palm Springs, Calif., Chamber of Commerce, an oil portrait of himself, two dozen golf balls, birthday greetings from fifth-graders in Abilene, Kan., several medals and keys to cities.

He also received a lace handkerchief to take back home to Mammie.

This outpouring of gifts keeps the President's secretary — Mrs. Ann Whitman — busy sending out thank-you notes along the way. Many of the gifts will end up in the Eisenhower Museum at Abilene.

On his goodwill call to Mexico, the President also received — and gave — an abrazo. This, for those not familiar with Latin traditions, is a big hug that demonstrates old friendship between the men locked in embrace.

Eisenhower was rusty on the protocol. Instead of flinging his arms wide around Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateos, he ended up by clutching Lopez Mateos' right hand with his left hand and "hurt" and should evoke maternal sympathy.

To an insecure teen-ager, externals are all. Note the brigade of pals, all with scuffed saddle-shoes, all with tan polo coats with six, not five of seven, large white buttons in front. This means, "I belong. They accept me. I'm one of them." Hence the misery of all but the most strong-minded when, through lack of money or parental edict, they can't "go along."

Some day Violet may be ready to accept her mother's sound counsel on real and more lasting values, on the intangibles and invisibles. But right now being part of the crowd is the most important urge in her life.

During Open School Week, Mrs. M. can dress carefully, meet the other mothers and the teachers on the basis of their similar interests, and then—perhaps—be "herself" by accepting a place on a busy committee and contributing her fresh and original thoughts.

The President disrupted a women's golf tournament when his helicopter landed unexpectedly at Eldorado Country Club in Palm Springs, Calif., last week.

A bevy of shorts-clad blondes ran over to deliver their version of the "abrazo." Blushing slightly, the President said he hoped the photographs would not get transmitted nationally. They were.

On his goodwill call to Mexico, the President also received — and gave — an abrazo. This, for those not familiar with Latin traditions, is a big hug that demonstrates old friendship between the men locked in embrace.

Eisenhower was rusty on the protocol. Instead of flinging his arms wide around Mexican President Adolfo Lopez Mateos, he ended up by clutching Lopez Mateos' right hand with his left hand and "hurt" and should evoke maternal sympathy.

To an insecure teen-ager, externals are all. Note the brigade of pals, all with scuffed saddle-shoes, all with tan polo coats with six, not five of seven, large white buttons in front.
