Sen. John F. Kennedy (TV interview): "I don't think that our position in the world is as satisfactory as it should be or could be."

Medical care under our old-age assistance program needs to be improved.

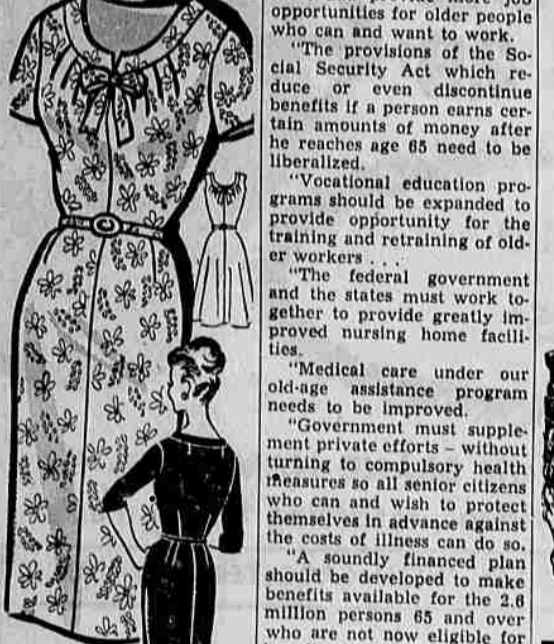
Government must supplement private efforts — without turning to compulsory health measures so all senior citizens who can and wish to protect the costs of illness can do so.

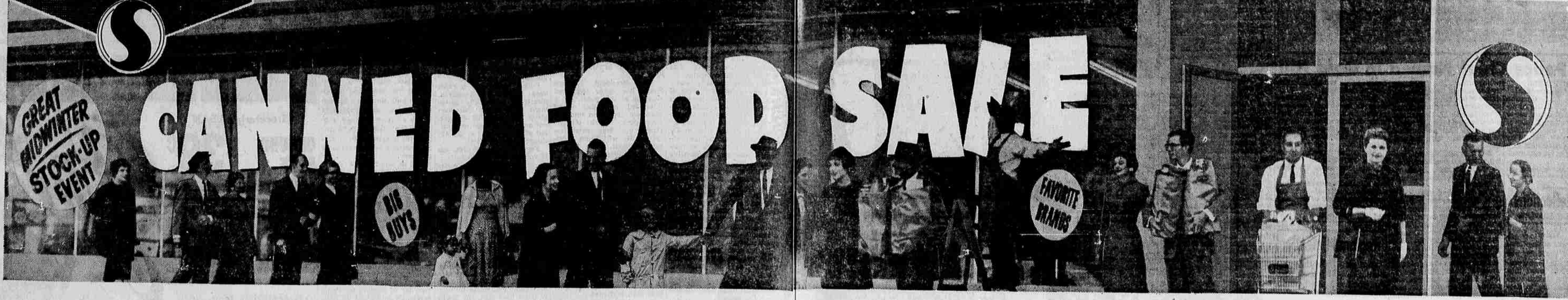

What Is The Law?

Executed Copies of Wills Should be Protected

Sam, a widower, with no children, cared for his invalid sister, Maude, for many years before his death. He had three (weal)ly brothers who had refused to help support Maude. Several months before he died, Sam executed a will leaving all his assets to Maude in order to provide for her for the rest of her life. Sam took an executed copy of the will home with him and placed it in a bureau drawer. But, when Sam died, the copy could not be found in the bureau or elsewhere in his house.

Does his sister Maude get all of Sam's property under the will or will his assets be divided among Sam's brothers and sister as though Sam died without a will?

Danger Pointed Out

The question points out the danger of failing to properly care for executed copies of wills. It is presumed that a will is revoked if the will (or a properly executed copy of the will) is last seen in the possession of the testator (the person who made the will) and can not be found at his death. This presumption is based on the theory that the will has probably been destroyed by the testator who intended to revoke it. Of course, this presumption can be overcome by evidence to show that no such thing occurred; but, such evidence is often not available.

Since a testator can revoke his will by nearly any type of act upon it (tearing, mutilating, burning, obliterating or canceling) accompanied by an intent to revoke, it is very important to preserve the instrument in its original form. It is unwise to write on it or to damage it in any way. The

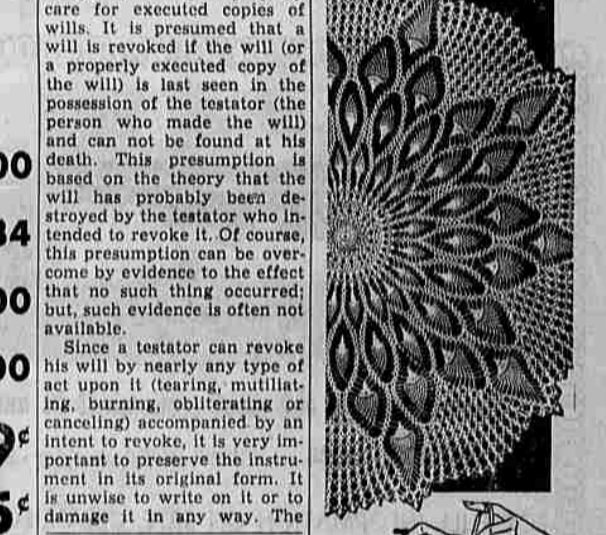
Measure 13, an amendment concerning war veterans' bonding and loans, received endorsement recently at a meeting of the Medford Multiple Listing Service. Clark Walker, spokesman for the service, said the service's approval was motivated by several points other than the "obvious desire of realtors to promote their own potential income."

Among the reasons for endorsement of the amendment, he added, were the need for financing farm and suburban properties, the creation of new taxpayers through home ownership, the added employment of Oregon's financial standing, and because the Veterans' loan program actually has shown a profit and involves no additional taxation.
