Cat Care Society Seeks Assistance From County

There is a definite need of cooperation of the County Dog Control board and the Southern Oregon Humane society for the picking up of stray and unwanted cats in view of the spread of rabies in the state, officials of the Cat Care society said today.

Persons may protect their own pets with inoculations against rabies, but the stray and unwanted animal, whether cat or dog, will be the greatest source of spreading the disease, it was stated, not only to other animals, but to the child who may pet them, they added.

The Cat Care society was formed to further humane education and to provide care and placement for cats and kittens. However, officials said that stray and unwanted cats reported to them for pick up has become so great that they are unable to take care of all requests.
