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Capitol Memo

Chairmen of Both Parties in Oregon Predict Victory

Salem — Oregon's Democratic and Republican party chairmen are on a publishing pace, rushing to check the last-minute pulse of how the election will go next Tuesday.

Republican Chairman Walter Norblad is on a final swing through all of Oregon's 36 counties. Democrat Robert Straub is concentrating on western and central Oregon.

Gunnar, a Salem lawyer, is optimistic despite the 75,000-plus Democratic voter registration edge. "We've been so well organized as we've ever been," he explains, "and the GOP candidates are going to attract bipartisan support."

Gunnar said he is looking for at least a five per cent crossover from the Democratic party and has been pounding the way for a 100 per cent Republican turnout.

Straub Not Comfortable
Even with the record registration advantage, Straub—a Springfield farmer-businessman and state senator—doesn't feel entirely comfortable. "It's definitely a toss-up," he says, "but we recognize that all persons registered as Democrats don't vote in the right."

He cited a poll saying that three times as many Democrats as Republicans cross party lines on election day. On top of that, the GOP traditionally turns out five per cent more of its registered voters at the polls, he said.

Both predict their presidential candidates will carry the state but neither dares to estimate by how much.

Gunnar, a Republican, Elmo Smith and Democrat Maurine Neuberger are "neck and neck" in the U.S. Senate race. "A camera couldn't tell them apart now," Straub agrees, insisting that Mrs. Neuberger has a strong lead.

Easy Time for Green
The Democratic candidate who will have the easiest time of it, according to Straub, is Congressman Edith Green, matched in the Third district against Republican Wallace Lee, Portland businessman.

Gunnar says the same for Congressman Walter Norblad in the First district. He is opposed by Mary Owens, the Army private that Norblad helped get discharged.

Straub thinks the closest race is secretary of state. Gunnar says that Gov. Mark Hatfield has been a "great help in this campaign, and most effective in the legislative races." Hatfield has campaigned in nearly every county and Gunnar has predicted Republican gains in the legislature.

Said Help To Demos
I don't see any evidence that Gov. Hatfield's campaigning has hurt us," Straub says. "In some cases he has actually helped Democrats with his in e.p.t. inaccurate remarks."

Straub specifically mentioned Hatfield's attack in eastern Oregon against Congressman Al Ullman. The governor in a speech for GOP Second district candidate Ronald Phair charged Ullman with attempting to sidetrack the Boardman land exchange deal with the federal government.

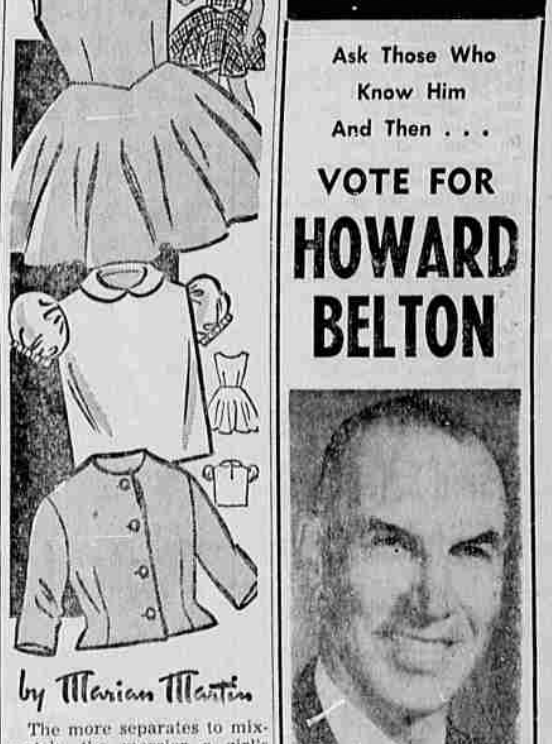
Although Straub doubts Hatfield's effectiveness in this campaign, he supports the governor's right to do so. Some Democrats have urged Straub to criticize Hatfield for spending so much time on the stump.

"I don't see it that way," Straub said. "This is a proper function in his role as the head of his state party."

Straub flatly predicts the Democrats will pick up at least one more seat in the state senate, giving them 20 out of 30, and five seats in the house, giving them 38 out of 60.
