Quoting the Candidates

Vice President Richard M. Nixon:

(In televised portion of New York City Coliseum rally): "My opponent has had something to say about the President giving me his support. I would be worried if I were him—with Truman on his side... and Eisenhower on mine."

(To Coliseum crowd after TV program): "Biggest single issue in the campaign is whether U.S. foreign policy shall be built on principles that kept the peace without surrender or whether we change to new, untried leadership."

"Under Eisenhower wise and forceful and decisive leadership has avoided involvement in war... If we had had leadership that was in-

experienced... the United States and the world might have been plunged into war."

"The President refused to apologize for the U2 flights... Kennedy said he could have apologized, could have expressed regret... I think the President is right..."

"If some of Kennedy's views had been enacted, they could have meant war or surrender."

(On "Nixon at Seven" TV show): "Those things Kennedy says about President Eisenhower, I resent and the American people resent..."

"Kennedy is arrogant... despicable... irresponsible..."

"The people are right and Kennedy is wrong on the state of the economy. We will have no recession because he isn't going to win."

Sen. John F. Kennedy:

(In statement released in Los Angeles): "A transparent political maneuver lies behind the administration's decision to release an additional \$155 million for development of the B70. The objective is not to increase national defense; it is to increase Republican votes."

(In San Francisco speech): "The nation cannot discontinue training our young men as soldiers of war but we also need them as 'ambassadors of peace.'"

"I therefore propose that our inadequate efforts in this area be supplemented by a 'peace corps' of talented young men willing and able to serve their country in this connection for three years as an alternate of peacetime Selective Service—well qualified through rigorous standards, skills and customs they will need to know, and directed and paid by the ICA-Point Four foreign aid agencies..."

"Too many Eisenhower administration ambassadors have been ill-chosen, ill-equipped and ill-briefed... Campaign contributions have been regarded as a substitute for experience..."

"The administration has met foreign policy problems by creating 75 different committees and conferences... Nixon has announced a new committee or conference himself on the average of once a week in this campaign."

Wall Street Chatter

New York—(UPI)—Prentice-Hall, Inc., says the relatively few "steady growth" and defensive stocks which have managed to resist the general downturn continue to be favored by large institutional investors. The reverse is true for gold stocks which would be avoided at their current price levels.

Martin Gilbert of Van Alstyne, Noel & Co. says that although many groups and individual issues have given signs of bottoming out, prices generally will be maintained in the 565-600 range of the Dow-Jones industrials with further tests to be expected at the top and bottom levels.

Clark, Dodge & Co. says that among the general aircraft companies earnings may not be steady but Beech, Cessna and Piper should double their income over the next five years. The firm prefers Piper because of its minor dependence on military spending, although over the near term Beech is expected to benefit from the expansion of the B70 program.

While its fortunes are closely tied to the capital goods industry, the longer range outlook for Pfaunder Permutit, Ind., seems favorable, according to Reynolds & Co. even on the assumption that 1961 profits may fall modestly under the 1960's, recent changes in the company's corporate image and the improving quality of its basic earning power should assure it a higher investment rating.

Barbara Burns Faces Drug Charge

Los Angeles—(UPI)—Barbara Ann Burns, 22, faces another court appearance Monday on a narcotics charge.

The self-styled "ugly duckling" daughter of the late comedian Bob (Bazooka) Burns was arraigned Wednesday with three young men on a charge of possessing marijuana and was ordered to appear at a preliminary hearing. She and the youths—William Bellah, 19, of Canoga Park, Michael McKaegan, 20, of Studio City and Arthur Vasquez, 27, of Los Angeles—were arrested Monday when a drive-in manager reported they appeared "glassy-eyed."

For Miss Burns it was another of a series of run-ins with the law on narcotics charges. At the time of her arrest she had just completed a three-month narcotics sentence at Camarillo State hospital and was on probation.
