

Graham Urges Thought in Vote

New York — (UPI) — Evangelist Billy Graham called on Americans today to choose the next president "as it were, on our knees," in sober thoughtfulness unswayed by bitterness or ignorance.

Writing in Life magazine, Graham made only two fleeting references to the possibility of the religious issue affecting voters next Tuesday. But the article constituted a plea against such voting.

"How do we decide who will give us the best leadership during the most dangerous years of our history?" Graham asked. "Certainly we should not decide on the basis of which candidate is more handsome or more charming. Neither should we follow the dubious path of tradition and say, 'I'll vote for my party, right or wrong.' That is bigotry at its worst. Neither should our vote be based on prejudice."

Home Town Band Pleases President

New York — (UPI) — President Eisenhower's "home town" high school band made a big hit with the President Wednesday night.

The 67-member Gettysburg, Pa., High School band helped whip up the enthusiasm for a rally outside the New York Coliseum where Eisenhower and Vice President Richard M. Nixon made a nationwide TV appearance.

Afterwards, the President extended special thanks to the band "from my hometown" for the "lift and inspiration" they furnished him.

"Thank you very much," he told the bandmen, who made a special trip from Gettysburg to participate in the rally.

"We came here to honor Ike, since we're his hometown band," said director Clifford B. Snowberger.

Former Willamette President Dies

Portland — (UPI) — Dr. Charles O. Boyer, 88, a physician, surgeon and one time acting president of Willamette University, died Tuesday. Funeral services will be held Friday at 1 p.m. at Colonial Mortuary.

He was born Aug. 9, 1872 at Casey, Iowa. Prior to retirement in 1952, he practiced medicine here.

He was a member of the Founders and Patrons of College of Puget Sound and served as its acting president in 1902-03. Until 1912 he served as an educator in various Methodist schools, including a period as professor and acting president of Willamette.

Newhouse Uses Brace, Crutches

Portland — (UPI) — Donald Newhouse, 41, production manager of the Oregonian wounded Oct. 16 by a shotgun blast fired through a basement window of his home, was released from the hospital Wednesday.

Newhouse wore a brace on his right foot and used crutches. He still carries more than 100 shotgun pellets in his right hip, doctors said.

Police have assigned a special squad of detectives to look into every possible lead in the case. The Oregonian and the Oregon Journal have offered a \$10,000 reward for information leading to conviction of the person responsible.

Indian Timber Sales \$8,263,827

Portland — (UPI) — Sales of timber from Indian lands in the Pacific northwest during fiscal 1960 returned \$8,263,827, or 67 per cent of the total revenue from timber on Indian lands in the nation, the Department of Interior's regional office here said.

Sales from the Klamath reservation in Oregon were not included in the totals, but they amounted to 13,862,000 board feet at \$392,020.

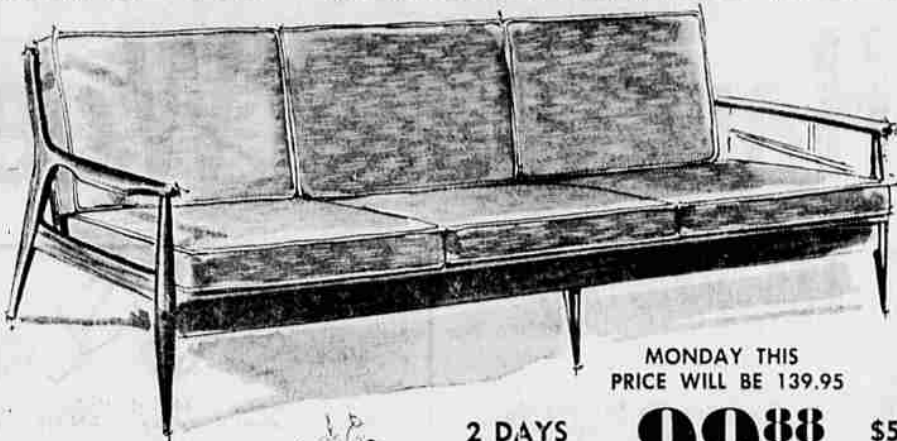
Other northwest reservations produced more than 370 million board feet, which is 62 per cent of the nation's total from Indian lands.
