Mel Robertson, Klamath Falls, led 16 keggers Saturday into the finals of the Oregon match game championships at Medford Bowling lanes. He topped a field of 48 entries who rolled Friday in semifinals here in the Oregon Bowling Proprietors association-sponsored tournament. Robertson compiled a 2514 score for 12 games, for a 209 plus average. He was followed by Jim Smith, Springfield, who fired 2482 and averaged 206 plus 10.

Washington Overwhelms Southern Cal 34 to 0

Los Angeles — University of Washington, outplayed in the first half, came on strong in the final quarter Saturday to overwhelm a dedicated but over-anxious Southern California team 34-0 and virtually clinch a Rose Bowl bid. The Trojans had dedicated the game to their star guard, Mike McKeever, who underwent brain surgery this week. But they were so tense that they beat themselves with fumbles, one bobble setting up the Huskies first touchdown and another costing Southern California a possible score.

Football Powers Tumbled

By United Press International — Minnesota hammered out a 27-10 victory over Iowa Saturday in the big game of a college football scene marked by upsets of such national powers as Navy, Tennessee, Syracuse, Rice and Baylor. The wave of form reversals, ushering in the final phase of the season, left Minnesota, Missouri, Yale, Utah State, and New Mexico State as the nation's only major powers with perfect records. Missouri made it eight in a row with a 16-6 victory over Colorado, Yale walloped Pennsylvania, 34-9, and Utah State defeated Wyoming, 17-13. New Mexico State was idle.

Ashland Subdues Crater High 33-6

Ashland — Ashland High school's Grizzlies, headed by the running of speedsters Bob Voris and Forrest Farmer, claimed lone third place in the Southern Oregon conference football standings Friday night after bouncing Crater 33 to 6. It was the second win for Ashland over the Central Point school this season and made the Grizzlies 2-2 for the loop and 6-3 for the season. Previous win over the Comets was just 27 to 26.

UCLA Whips California Easily 28-0

Berkeley — Bill Kilmer, UCLA's one-man gang, ran, passed and kicked the Bruins to a one-sided 28-0 victory over California yesterday before 31,000 rain-dampened fans. Taking command of the situation right at the start, here's what Kilmer, a talented tailback, did while playing through the first three quarters of the game: Gained a total of 225 yards. Quick-kicked three times for an average of 51.7 yards, one kick going 78 yards. Completed eight out of 11 passes, good for 116 yards. Gained 100 yards running. And scored two touchdowns. It was another in a series of brilliant performances for the happy-go-lucky Bruin senior from Azusa, Calif.

Bob Harrison Starter Again

San Francisco — Middle linebacker Bob Harrison and offensive end Dee Mackey have been named to start today for the San Francisco Forty Niners in their Kezar stadium tussle with Detroit. Harrison was slated to start the season at the key defensive post, but was demoted by Coach Red Hickey, who tried various other players there and finally settled on Ed Henke.
