# Van Brocklin Leads Eagles To Triumph Over Steelers

Norm Van Brocklin of the Philadelphia Eagles is challenging Johnny Unitas of the Baltimore Colts as the National Football League's quarterback-of-the-year, and the battle could go all the way to the championship playoff.

Van Brocklin, who at 33 is having one of his greatest seasons, threw three touchdowns Sunday as the Eagles crushed the Pittsburgh Steelers, 34-7, and took over sole possession of first place in the Eastern Division with a 5-1 record. In all, he completed 19 of 30 passes for a total of 295 yards.

Van Brocklin completed touchdown passes of 24, 39 and 26 to Tommy McDonald as the Eagles beat the Steelers for their fifth straight.
