Immunization Can Be Used Against Valley Fever Now

San Francisco (Science Service) - Immunization against valley fever is possible - for mice at least and soon may be for man, two University of California scientists from Berkeley reported here.

This experimental vaccine can cut deaths from more than 50 per cent in non-vaccinated mice to less than five per cent.

Valley fever, known technically as coccidioidomycosis, is a lung disease caused by an airborne fungus prevalent in arid regions of California and the southwestern United States.

The vaccine's effectiveness was demonstrated on animals infected by fungal spores entering the lungs via the nasal passages, which is the same way that man contracts the disease.

Problems remain to be solved, however, before tests can be made on man, Dr. Hillev B. Levine, associate bacteriologist, reported to the American Public Health Association.

Hope for an effective vaccine arose from Smith's work several years ago showing that even the mildest case of valley fever leaves the patient with a lifelong immunity to the disease.

Other studies showed that in highly endemic areas, such as near Bakersfield, Phoenix and El Paso, the disease infects almost 95 per cent of the residents.

The work of Levine and Smith is based upon the known fact that the fungus Coccidioides immitis undergoes a startling change when it leaves the soil and infects man or animals.

Instead of focusing on the soil, as others had done in attempts to develop a vaccine, the California scientists worked out improved methods for growing and purifying large amounts of the fungus spores and endospores - forms that are found in the infected body.

First they infected the vaccinated animals by the nasal route with up to 500 valley fever spore particles. Next they infected non-vaccinated mice with only 20 or 30 spore particles. Some 50 per cent died.

Eventually, they found that it took about 1,000 particles - far more than the number infecting man under natural conditions - to kill 50 per cent of the vaccinated mice.

Pear Decline Study Opens in California

Berkeley, Calif. (UPI) - A University of California agricultural specialist said Monday an extensive economic study is underway to help California pear ranchers, whose orchards are plagued by a blight.

Dean Daniel G. Aldrich of the university's division of agricultural sciences said economists from the Glanville Foundation and the U.S. Agricultural Extension Service will attempt to determine whether in some instances an alternate crop could be planted.

Aldrich said the disease known as pear decline hit the \$27 million California pear industry last year after sweeping through Washington and British Columbia. Oregon pears also have been hit by the disease.

University plant pathologists are working on the disease, Aldrich said, but in the meantime ranchers must have other ways of making a livelihood.

Information to be made available to the farmers, he said, included what other type, if any, crop should be planted, costs, and the feasibility of replanting a diseased orchard.

Replanting has been done successfully in Washington, Aldrich said, but only with domestic rootstocks not susceptible to the decline.

'Formula' Method Of Diet Unsound

Chicago, (Science Service) -The use of complete formula diets is "not a medically sound means" of reducing weight, Dr. Philip L. White, secretary of the American Medical Association's council on foods and nutrition, charged here.

He said that selecting a variety of foods and controlling caloric intake "is the only long-term technique that has sound medical judgment behind it."

Dr. White warned that no weight reduction program should be undertaken by anyone who is grossly overweight, except under medical supervision.

Only the physician is properly equipped to judge whether an overweight person should, in fact, reduce, Dr. White reported in the current issue of the American Medical Association's magazine, "Today's Health."

He said that selecting a variety of foods and controlling caloric intake "is the only long-term technique that has sound medical judgment behind it."

Dr. White warned that no weight reduction program should be undertaken by anyone who is grossly overweight, except under medical supervision.

Old Superstition In Entertainment World Noted Again

Hollywood (UPI) - An old entertainment superstition has it that death always strikes in threes.

It did this past week end, Star Ward Bond, 55, and pioneer moviemaker Mack Sennett, 80, were both cut down by heart attacks and movie hopeful Johnny Horton, 35, a top folk singer, died in an auto crash.

All three deaths came Saturday. They were followed Sunday by the hospitalization of Clark Gable, 59, with a heart attack. However, the king of Hollywood leading man for the past 30 years, was reported in good condition.

Mystic Number Again And for the superstitious, Gable's hospitalization again rounded out the mystic number of three in performers hospitalized. Both Judy Garland, 37, and silent screen idol Ramon Novarro, 61, were ill in London and apparently on the road to recovery.

While Bond was one of the entertainment world's biggest stars with his role in TV's "Wagon Train" series, and Sennett was one of the film land's pioneers in the silent screen days, Horton was

claimed by death before his career in films were started. The folk singer, killed in Cameron, Tex., in a two-car collision, was under contract with Paramount Pictures but had not yet made a movie. He recorded the hit song "Battle of New Orleans."

Miss Garland, 37, and her husband, Sid Luft, were recovering from acute food poisoning. Hollywood paid its last tribute Monday to Bond, who died in Dallas, Tex. He was there to attend a football game and his body was flown back to filmland Sunday for services in suburban Reseda.

Bond's death followed by less than 12 hours that of Sennett, the man who gave the entertainment world its first Keystone Kops and first introduced bathing beauties in his silent movies.

Sennett died at the Motion Picture Country Home where only the day before he had undergone an urological operation. A spokesman said death apparently resulted from a heart attack. Funeral services were to be
